



## Fleet Week in NYC Begins May 20

submitted by LTJG Megan Shutka Thousands of Sailors, Marines and Coast Guardsmen from U.S. Navy and U.S. Coast Guard ships will be in Manhattan for Fleet

Week New York, May 20-27. Hosted nearly every year since 1984, Fleet Week New York is the City's celebration of the sea services. This annual event also provides an opportunity for the citizens of New York City and the surrounding Tri-State area to meet Sailors, Marines and Coast Guardsmen, as well as witness first hand the latest capabilities of today's Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard Team.

Fleet Week includes dozens of military demonstrations and displays throughout the week, as well as public visitation of many of the participating ships.

Ship Tours will be held during

the week in Manhattan (USS Iwo Jima (LHD-7) at Pier 88N and USS Roosevelt (DDG-80) at Pier 90S).

USS Vella Gulf (CG-72, USS Thunderbolt (PC-12), USS Tempest (PC-2) and USS Hurricane (PC-3) will be at the pier on Staten Island.

General public touring in Staten Island and Manhattan will be conducted daily (except Sunday in Manhattan) from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Lines will be capped at 3 p.m.

No visitation will be conducted in Manhattan on Sunday. Visitors are encouraged to come early and are reminded that lines to visit these ships may be closed prior to scheduled visiting hours so that the last people in line have the opportunity to complete their tour in conjunction with the



end of visiting hours.

# DESIGN IDEAS: Ask the Design Expert: How to Stretch Your Decorating Dollars

### Dear Natalie,

I love the designer looks out there but I don't have the budget for all those expensive products that make a home beautiful. How can I get that look on my budget? Nancy R.

### Dear Nancy,

Creating that designer look on a budget is actually what I do. The budget may be large or small, but there's always a budget! If your limited budget is holding you back – don't let it. Thinking creatively, using expensive products in smaller amounts, can still achieve a great effect.

Here are some ways that principle can be applied, as well as other money saving tips:

- In the kitchen instead of using expensive glass tile for the entire backsplash, use a basic background tile and add glass tiles randomly, or in a single row or as a picture frame behind the cook top. Use a cheaper tile to fill in the rest.
- Instead of replacing kitchen cabinets that are in a wood

finish you don't like, consider refinishing existing cabinets or replacing doors. (This works well if the floor plan of your cabinetry and appliances is still the best one for your room.) This is also the option that is best for the environment!

- Instead of creating expensive wainscot raised panels, use ready made 4x8 sheets of bead board and add a chair rail molding cap at the proper height to finish it. (This works best in a casual home in areas such as powder room, hallway and dining room.)
- Use wallpaper that looks like *trompe l'oeil* (trick of the eye) painting instead of calling in


- Find ready made bedding that looks like custom and create the paint, carpet and window treatments around it.
- Respray tubs that are a dated color rather than ripping them out, or look to a bath refitting company that can get the job done in one day without costly rip out.
- Look for basic classic styles of furniture that are comfortable and won't be dated (in a fabric that is textural rather than printed patterns).
- Investing in a good quality area rug makes everything look expensive.
- Look to your home first to accessorize. Use books, photos and collectibles you've amassed to not only save money, but personalize your space. Instead of expensive art work, find prints that appeal to you and frame them well.
- Don't be afraid to mix styles that have integrity (perhaps English, French or American style pieces from past generations) with new purchases. People often make the wrong choice by keeping what's newer (mica and leather) and giving away beautiful timeless pieces that might need an investment of a little money and some TLC.

# NATURALLY SPEAKING: Enjoy A Summer of Flowers, Food and Fun

### by June A. Liardi

It is almost summer time, summer time, sum-summertime.

All of your heat loving vegetables can be in now, including peppers and eggplants. Also, put in some more cucumbers and summer squash to keep your harvest going. Put in some radish seeds in between those plants to keep striped cucumber beetles away.

Keep picking peas, lettuce and spinach before the real heat of the summer stops them from producing.

Put mulch in place, especially around tomato plants to retain moisture and keep weeds at bay. Pinch back your chrysanthemums again too. Dead head any other spent flowers while out there.

Put in some more beets, car-

rots and beans. Also put in seeds of cauliflower, broccoli and brussels sprouts for a September harvest.

You may be looking for some hardy plants that are *shade tolerant* and deer *in-tolerant*. here are a few:

- <u>Astilbe</u> This is a great shade plant with lacy foliage and blooms that can be spectacular.
- <u>Pulmonari</u> or lungwort These plants spread eagerly and boast spotted foliage with blooms from white, to pink and blue.
- <u>Huechera</u> or coral bells This is a great growing shade plant with pretty foliage and delicate small flowers.
- <u>Dicentra</u> or bleeding heart -Many will call this an old-

fashioned shade plant, but there is a reason it has been around for so very long. Those beautiful little dangling flowers are just delightful.

- <u>Aruncus</u> or Goatsbeard Has also been around a long time and looks similar to Astilbe. It can spread quite a distance and does not like to be transplanted, so it is best to plant it where it can stay.
- <u>Asarum</u> or wild ginger These are wonderful foliage plants with dark green shiny leaves. make sure the plant has rich, leafy soil to grow in.

These are just a few great plants to get your shade garden started.

ender-scented water to sprinkle on your laundry when you iron, or to spray on your sheets. Bring a quart of water to a boil in a stainless steel, glass or enamel pot. Drop a handful of fresh or dry lavender flowers, remove pot from heat and cover it. Let mixture steep over night then strain through a coffee filter. Discard lavender flowers and put scented water into a spray bottle. Water should not stain most fabrics, but test on an out-of-the-way spot just to be sure.

A nice gift for your child to give to a teacher is a small herb garden. Buy one or more small herb transplants at the local nursery. Pot them up in an attractive grouping in one pot. Your child could paint or otherwise decorate the pot before planting. They could attach shells to the pot or around the rim, or small pebbles, even dried moss or some other natural item. Have them make plant identification labels with the plant's name and picture. A listing of uses for the herb or a recipe or two also would be nice. Dad or Grandpa might also like this gift.

Make sure to visit a local farmstand to pick up some of the fresh strawberries ripe now. Make some whipped cream and present Dad with a strawberry shortcake for desert on his special day.

# MONEY MATTERS: Investing Lessons From the Vineyards

As an investor, you can get plenty of advice from financial experts on the evening news or cable financial shows. But you may actually be able to learn some deeper truths about investing by observing other professionals – such as winemakers.

At first glance, you might not see what these "guardians of the grape" can teach you about building an investment portfolio. After all, they're shaping Sangiovese while you're seeking stocks, they're bottling Burgundy while you're buying bonds, and they're mastering Malbec while you're monitoring mutual funds. Where's the connection?

Start by considering the life cycle of wine and the concept of "vintage." For example, a particular wine is labeled a 2005 vintage if it is made from grapes that were predominantly grown and harvested in 2005. Yet given the requirements of wine production, this 2005 vintage may not actually hit the markets until 2008 – and some aficionados may think the wine won't taste its best until 2018.



If you translated this type of scenario to the financial world, you could say that the 2008 investment "vintage" was not promising, given that the value of almost all investments – even the quality ones – fell last year. But if you were to hold these quality investments for the long term – as you should, because investing is a long-term activity – you might find that the 2008 vintage investments may eventually become productive vehicles that can help you achieve your financial goals.

So, what lessons can you learn from winemakers? Here are a few suggestions:

- **Be patient.** Winemakers put a lot of time, effort and money into planting today's grapes for which they will not see one penny of profit for many years. Yet they have the discipline to wait patiently until the products of their labors come to fruition. Are all their wines successful? No and all your investments may not be, either. But given enough time, quality investments can usually help you work toward your financial goals.
- Have faith in your strategy. Wine drinkers' tastes can change from year to year. Yet winemakers don't rip out their vineyards and replant them with today's "hot" varietal. Instead, they cultivate the grapes they've planted, make the best wine they can and maintain their belief that their continued on page 64

• Adapt your goals to your situation. One of the most famous winemaking regions in the world, Napa Valley, contains a number of microclimates that vary by temperature, rainfall and soil. Napa Valley winemakers know which grapes will do best in which microclimate, and they concentrate their efforts accordingly. And you, as an individual investor, should make your investment decisions based on your own "microclimate" - your risk tolerance, family situation, time horizon and other factors. In other words, you should choose those investments that are best suited for you and that have the best chance to help you meet your goals.

Investing, like winemaking, is filled with challenges. But by observing how winemakers work, you may learn some things that can eventually help you raise a glass to your own success.

## MORTGAGE MATTERS: Make Home Affordable Program

by Ann Mondrone

You may be like many homeowners who have been questioning why you have not been able to refinance your home mortgage to take advantage of the now lower rates. You may have been told that your lender cannot help you because, even though you have been making your payments on time, you are not eligible to refinance because the value of your home has dropped and you do not have enough equity to refinance. To make matters worse, you may also

have heard that the bank would only help you if you had fallen behind on your payments! I have heard many homeowners grumbling about this and recently even saw a bumper sticker that said, "Honk if I am paying your mortgage."

There may now be an opportunity for those who have previously been shut out of the refinance option. In February, the President announced the "Making Home Affordable Program" designed for homeowners exactly in this position. Although this program is only slowly being implemented by lenders, and although it will



not make refinancing available to all homeowners, you may be one of those who will be eligible.

There are two different programs – one for mortgages held by Freddie Mac and one for mortgages held by Fannie Mae. How do I know, you ask, who holds my mortgage? There is only one way to learn that, and that is to contact a company that is offering this program. I will attempt, however, to give you some of the important aspects of this program:

• The new mortgage cannot exceed 105% of the value of


your home.

- You must have a minimum FICO score of 620.
- PMI Insurance is not required (note that loans currently with PMI are not eligible).
- The existing mortgage must be current.
- Only the existing first mortgage debt can be included in the refinance. Second mortgages are not eligible, nor can the owner take additional cash
- The Freddie Mac version may limit your ability to include closing costs in the new loan

With mortgage interest rates at unprecedented levels, there is a tremendous window of opportunity to save money on your home mortgage payments. If you think you are qualified, contact a mortgage lender today.

## PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE: Do Money and Happiness Go Hand-in-Hand?

How many times have you said to yourself: If I only had a few extra thousand dollars a year, all my problems would be solved? The truth is that money usually has very little to do with your personal level of happiness. In and of itself, money possesses no value. It's not the money - it's how you use it that determines its worth. It's important to realize that achieving your goals lies in your ability to see money for what it really is - a tool, no more, no less. Just as your car gets you from one destination to another, money is a financial tool that, when used correctly, can help you reach your goals.

### Establish a "Wish List"

Deciding what is important to you is the first step to effective money management. Make a wish list of what you want for yourself and your family. Items such as a new home, new car, vacations, funding retirement or future college costs, or charitable donations may appear on your list. Next, prioritize your goals by deciding what is most important to you. Why? Because in a world of unlimited choices, you may have only limited resources. Finally, put a realistic price tag on each of your goals. For exam-



ple, you may want \$100,000 for college in 20 years. Or, you may like to retire with a \$500,000 nest egg in 30 years.

### How Do You Achieve These Goals?

Now that you have prioritized your goals, look to achieve shortterm objectives through daily money management. A household budget may help you decrease credit card debt, build a savings account, save for vacations, etc. A budget may help you to revise your spending habits, cut costs, and achieve short-term goals.

For long-term objectives, your best bet is to start saving a specific amount on a systematic basis. The more disciplined you are, the better your chances. For example, to accumulate \$500,000 for retirement in 30 years, you will need to save about \$6,000 a year, or approximately \$500 a month. You will need to put aside nearly \$2,600 a year, or \$210 a month, for a \$100,000 college fund in 20 years. (These examples assume a 6% rate of return and do not take into account the effect of current income taxes. They are for illustrative purposes only and do not represent the return on a specific financial product.)



um unit owners insurance protects the items you keep within your unit. Also, unit owners insurance may be needed to protect any additions or alterations you have made to your unit. *Know your responsibility*.





## Foreclosures – Some Words of Caution

In past articles, I have discussed the general processes of buying and selling a home as well as the process of the purchase of a short sale. This month, I would like to discuss the process of buying a home that has been (or is being) foreclosed upon and is currently bank owned. The single most important piece of advice I can give to someone looking to be involved with a foreclosure is DO YOUR HOMEWORK!!!!

Learn all you can about the values of the homes in the area, surrounding neighborhood as well as municipal requirements and guidelines for certificates of occupancy, certificates of completion and violations. I say this because once you find the fore-closure of your dreams and start



the process of going to contract, it will be too late. Once an offer is accepted, you will not have adequate time to research these issues because you will have a very short period to sign the contract. The banks permit very few, if any, contract modifications from the purchaser's attorney. The contract sent to the purchaser's attorney will be very onesided in favor of the selling bank. The foreclosing bank does not care if the house has certificates of occupancy or violations and will not condition the sale upon clearance of these issues. Generally, the foreclosing bank will not clear up all of the title issues that typically are the seller's responsibility.

Also, the foreclosing bank gives approximately two to three continued on page 78

continued from page 76 weeks (versus generally 30 to 45 days) for purchaser to obtain a mortgage commitment. Notice requirements are extremely strict and there are many opportunities for the purchaser's contract downpayment to be forfeited. I would also urge a prospective foreclosure purchaser to be familiar with the lending and title requirements of several lenders and make sure to work with a lender/mortgage broker or mortgage banker that is able to get the loan cleared with tight deadlines

and likely troubling issues of missing certificates of occupancy or even violations. You don't want to learn that the lender is unable to fund the loan halfway through the process, because the seller (foreclosing bank) will likely not extend any deadlines. Downpayments are at risk!

I give this information not to scare people away from buying a foreclosure, but rather to protect the buyer and ensure as minimum risk as possible. It is very important to have an attorney who can differentiate between issues that should cause a purchaser to walk away from a transaction from those problems which can be cured by the purchaser after closing.

## **Real Estate Short Sales**

During these difficult times the market value of homes often falls below the amount payable on the mortgage. If such a home is sold, the seller would not receive enough funds from the sale to satisfy the mortgage lien. If the sellers do not have sufficient funds beyond the funds received from the sale of the home to satisfy the mortgage lien, the holder of the mortgage, that is the bank, will often agree to accept the proceeds of the sale in full settlement of the mortgage lien. That transaction is called a short sale.

That scenario complicates the sale and purchase of the home for both the sellers and the buyers. The sellers have to request the mortgage holder to take less, but the mortgage holder will not take less without satisfying itself that



the sellers are not able to pay the full mortgage lien. That takes time and money.

Another consequence to the sellers is that the amount of the mortgage reduction allowed by the bank will be taxable income to the sellers as ordinary income. The sellers may be better off filing a bankruptcy proceeding in order to discharge the obligation of the mortgage note.

A short sale is also complicated for the purchasers. The purchasers will have to wait for the bank to agree to accept less than the full mortgage balance which can take many months during which the fair market value of the home may decline. If the bank ultimately does not agree to the short sale, the purchasers will have incurred legal fees to enter into the contract of sale and they may pay more for their new home if real estate prices rise in the interim.

In summary, both sellers and buyers of homes should avoid a short sale except in extraordinary circumstances.



## Headaches (part II/III)

#### Migraine Headaches

Each year, about 25 million people in the U.S. experience migraine headaches, and about 75% are women. Migraines are intense and throbbing headaches that are often associated with nausea and sensitivity to light or noise. They can last from as little as a few hours to as long as a few days. Many of those who suffer from migraines experience visual symptoms called an "aura" just prior to an attack that is often described as seeing flashing lights or that everything takes on a dream-like appearance.

Migraine sufferers usually have their first attack before age 30 and they tend to run in families, supporting the notion that there is a genetic component to them. Some people have attacks several times a month; others have less than one a year. Most people find that migraine attacks occur less frequently and become less severe as they get older.

Migraine headaches are caused by a constriction of the blood vessels in the brain, followed by a dilation of blood vessels. During the constriction of the blood vessels there is a decrease in blood flow. which is what leads to the visual symptoms that many people experience. Even in people who don't experience the classic migraine aura, most of them can tell that an attack is immanent. Once the blood vessels dilate, there is a rapid increase in blood pressure inside the head. It is this increased pressure that leads to the pounding headache. Each time the heart beats it sends another shock wave through the carotid arteries in the neck up into the brain.

There are many theories about why the blood vessels constrict in the first place, but no one knows for sure. What we do know is that there are a number of things that can trigger migraines, such as lack of sleep, stress, flickering lights, strong odors, changing weather patterns and several foods; especially foods that are high in an amino acid called 'tyramine.'You can reduce the likelihood of migraine headaches by making some lifestyle changes.

#### **Cluster Headaches**

Cluster headaches are typically very short in duration, excruciating headaches, usually felt on one side of the head behind the eyes. Cluster SERVING THE ST. JAMES COMMUNITY



headaches affect about 1 million people in the United States and, unlike migraines, are much more common in men. This is the only type of headache that tends to occur at night. The reason that they are called 'cluster' headaches is that they tend to occur one to four times per day over a period of several days. After one cluster of headaches is over, it may be months or even years, before they occur again. Like migraines, cluster headaches are likely to be related to a dilation of the blood vessels in the brain, causing a localized increase in pressure.



## Sacroiliac Joint Pain

Sacroiliac joint pain can interfere with standing, walking, lifting, and changing positions; i.e., rising from a seated position, turning over in bed. When a sacroiliac dysfunction is not cared for properly, chronic back pain can develop. Fortunately, most sacroiliac conditions respond well to chiropractic care, proper support and rehabilitation exercises.

The sacroiliac SI joints are the source of many symptoms categorized as mechanical low back pain. There often is a pattern of unilateral pain extending from the lowest part of the spine into the buttock and/or down the back of the upper leg. This may vary from patient to patient.

The pelvic ring is made up of two innominated bones that are joined anteriorly at the pubic symphysis and are separated posteriorly by the sacrum. The main function o the SI joints are to support the vertebral column, transmit motion and weight bearing between the spine, pelvis and the lower extremities.

Acute sprain of the sacroiliac presents as a sudden onset of unilateral pain. Sacroiliac pain is usually caused by forceful twisting or heavy lifting, especially improper lifting. Unguarded motions, like stepping off a curb or even twisting in bed can cause SI sprains.

Recurrent problems of the SI joint and non traumatic subluxations are often due to biomechanical instabilities. Pain is often aggravated by prolonged or repetitive weight bearing activities. Chronic dysfunction of the joint will lead to degeneration. Patients will often get dramatic relief from specific SI adjustments but the condition tends to recur. Often a search for underlying gait problems and/or biomechanical instabilities need to

be addressed. Because the SI joints are so intimately involved in gait, proper foot gear and or orthotics are necessary to support chiropractic adjustments. Rehabilitative exercises focusing on the abdominal and supporting pelvic muscles are a must to support the corrective changes being made through the chiropractic adjustments.

In conclusion, the SI joints are closely associated with efficient gait and proper support of the spine. A patient with SI dysfunction usually responds well to chiropractic care. See your chiropractor today to enhance your health and lifestyle.

## The Dreaded Plateau

Life can become monotonous when we do the same thing day in and day out. When your body stops responding (in a good way) to your same workout routine it is called plateauing and the results of our exercise routine cease. Our muscles have memory, that is to say they adapt to the "stress" you put on them during a workout. Think about it, the first time you try a new exercise, your muscles will be sore the next day (hopefully) but the next time you perform that exercise they are less sore until eventually you coast right through the exercise. Alas, the dreaded plateau has hit!

The good news is plateaus can be beat, all you need to do is change up your routine. Experts suggest that you should change up your exercise routine every 3-4 weeks to break the plateau cycle. Here are a few simple suggestions to help you break the cycle:

- Consider changing the time of day you exercise. Try waking up early and take advantage of the jump-start your metabolism receives which will put your body to work burning more calories throughout the day.
- If you do your cardio workout first and then your weights, try it in reverse.



- Take a night off from the gym and enjoy an activity with family/friends.
- Review your diet, make sure that you are eating enough calories to maintain your muscle mass, if not your metabolism could slow down thus causing a plateau.
- Make sure you are getting enough sleep, I have already written about the importance of sleep.
- Incorporate interval training in your workouts jog or sprint on the treadmill for short bursts.
- Try fatiguing your muscles in a new pattern. If you always do abs last, do them first.

- Replace some of your exercises to add some variety and *muscle confusion*. Instead of doing a dumbbell fly on the bench try doing it on a stability ball.
- Change up your reps on an exercise if your normally do 3 sets of 10, try doing 3 sets of 8 with a heavier weight or go crazy and do 4 sets of 4 with heavy weights. You can also reverse that and go lighter on the weight and do 3 sets of 15.
- Try something new yes you can! Check out that SPIN class, try kettle bells, resistance bands, try training with a buddy, register for a race, ride your bike to the gym, or better yet, break out your roller blades, the derby is coming to town!

Whatever you do, shake it up this month, try something new! Get out and enjoy some warm weather and sun!

## **Engagement Party Etiquette**

When it comes to weddings, it seems there are as many traditions as there are guests. Unless you've taken the trip down the aisle before, chances are you're in for a surprise or two with respect to what's expected of you once the pre-wedding planning and commitments start to take shape.

One aspect of the wedding that isn't obligatory but has become popular over the years is the engagement party. While it's not mandatory, the engagement party is something more and more couples have chosen to include as part of their prewedding planning. And just like most other things associated with weddings, the engagement party comes with its own etiquette as well.

• Invitations: While this might seem like a no-brainer, it's important that only those guests who will be invited to the wedding are invited to the engagement party. No one who won't be getting a wedding invite should be invited to the engagement party. In addition, not all wedding invitees should be invited to the engagement party.

• **Gifts:** The engagement party is a celebration of the engagement and somewhat of a meet-and-greet for the couple's parents and other family members. Guests are not expected to bring gifts, but if they do, open them in private or after the party.

• **Toasts:** The bride's father is expected to offer the first toast of the evening in honor of the bride- and groom-to-be. Guests then take a drink, but the couple does not. The groom-to-be then says a few words before toasting his bride-to-be and her family. Other guests can then offer toasts if they're so inclined.

• Hosting duties: It's often considered the responsibility of the bride's parents to host the engagement party, but this isn't set in stone. If the bride's parents are divorced, for instance, the party can be hosted by another relative of the bride's. However, the best man or the maid of honor should not be considered as hosts of the engagement party, as they will have additional responsibilities down the road.

• **Timing:** Because the length of engagements varies greatly depending on the couple, timing can be another tricky element of the engagement party. For those who will have a particularly lengthy engagement, one to three months after the initial announcement is generally the norm for the engagement party. Another good rule of thumb for those with longer engagements is that the party should take place roughly a year before the wedding. Couples with shorter engagements, on the other hand, can get by with an engagement party roughly six months before the wedding.




