Median sales price declined 13.9% to \$421,250 and average sales price declined 11.9% to \$517,736 respectively from the same period last year.

Sales surged 54.8% to 698, outpacing the 4.4% gain in inventory to 758 from the prior year quarter resulting in a faster paced market.

Luxury price indicators increased from the prior year quarter, outperforming the overall market. Median sales price increased 9.1% to \$1,250,000 and average sales price increased 10.2% to \$1,572,825 respectively over the same period.

Luxury days on market expanded by three weeks to 122 days as listing inventory expanded by 30 days respectively, from the prior year quarter.

OPERATION, SANTA CLAUS

Fire Department's 34th Annual Christmas & Holiday Parade December 20

Santa Claus is coming to town Saturday, December 20, 2014. The St. James Fire Department will once again play host to Santa Claus and his friends for the 34th annual Christmas and Holiday Parade "The Festival of Lights."

The St. James Fire Department Ambulance Company is having a food drive for the local food pantry and are requesting all donations of nonperishable food items to be brought to the Main Fire House on Route 25A and Lake Avenue before 5 p.m. on December 20. They will also be collecting at the Mills Pond Elementary School at approximately 7:15 p.m. that night.



June Capossela Kempf, of St. James, is the author of Yo God! Jay's Story, a book to honor her son Jay who died from Muscular Dystrophy at the age of 21. After her marriage to best friend Ron, June moved to Long Island where she split her time between raising three children, and working a potpourri of part time jobs ranging from substitute teaching to banking.

When her youngest son developed a serious life threatening disease, June was forced to deal with the challenges of care giving, schooling, sibling rivalry; as well as threats to relationships with extended family, friends and God. Seeking more community support, June and her husband eventually discovered the Muscular Dystrophy Association (MDA), where they went on to devote 30 years, volunteering for *Jerry's kids*.

For June, coping meant writing. She soon began cranking out articles for the MDA newsletter covering subjects of interest to Suffolk County chapter kids and their families. She wrote poems and stories, some of which were

published in the Canine Companions for Independence publication and appeared in the National Library of Poetry. She received a second prize award from the Angel Animal Network for a story about her son's service dog. Most recently June received an acknowledgement from Reader's Digest resulting from a contest entitled *My life in 150 Words*.

When Jonathan (Jay) died, June

dedicated herself to giving meaning to his life. In his memoir, Yo God! Jay's Story she pours out her heart and soul describing her continued connection with Jay in an effort to fulfill his wish: "to make a difference." Jay accepted his disabilities with courage and style and everyone who met him walked away with a smile.

In addition, June has just completed a short work, *Lady of the Dollhouse*, a novella for middle grade children – inspired by a local dollhouse maker and is working on a new work, *One Good Day*, that covers one day's routine for a disabled pre-teen.

June also facilitates an adult writers group at the Smithtown Library and is a member of the Long Island Authors and Writers Society (LIAWS). When not tethered to her word processor, June enjoys her grandchildren, singing in the choir, reading, walks on the beach, seagulls and Yellow Labs romping in the sand.

Phil DeBlasio always knew he wanted to build. Born in Queens, he grew up in Smithtown and has lived in St. James for 24 years. He began working at an early age and hasn't stopped, starting his construction company 26 years ago. In 2013 along with a group called “Dylan’s Footprint,” Building Hope for Long Island Foundation demolished an existing home and built a now accessible home for single mom Gloria Thompson and her son, Dylan, an 18-year-old man confined to a wheelchair as a result of Duchene’s Muscular Dystrophy.

Recently, Building Hope for Long Island Foundation hooked up with “Brother of Mine” spearheaded by Michael Conte, another resident of St. James, which helps returning wounded veterans. Marine Captain Ben Harrow lost both his legs above the knee and had severe damage to his right arm and hand when he stepped on an IED while leading his team of Green Berets on an anti-terrorism mission in Afghanistan during his third tour of duty, two previous tours in Iraq. A true hero, his positive attitude and determination to cope with adversity has set an example for many wounded vets returning home to a far different life than they left. Captain Harrow’s new home represents only one small “thank you” for what he has sacrificed for his country.

Building Hope for Long Island Foundation has an annual golf outing and various smaller events and has been successful in raising money for all these projects. It is also due to the generous support of neighbors and trades that volunteer their time and expertise to execute these builds. Donations are always welcome and can be made

NEWS OF LONG AGO:

What Will It Be, Thanksgiving or Harvest Home?

With the celebration of Thanksgiving this month, I thought that it would be interesting to take a look at what is known about the very first celebration of Thanksgiving that took place in October of 1621 in Plymouth, Massachusetts when the Pilgrims celebrated the harvest of their crops.

Thanksgiving is one of those holidays that we all enjoy as a day when family and friends gather and share a traditional meal of turkey and the trimmings. It is as traditional as apple pie and ice cream, an all American holiday. Yet it isn't. For one thing, the celebration is certainly

English in origin. Another thing to keep in mind is that the holiday and its celebration has evolved and changed with the passage of time. Thanksgiving Day as we know it today began with President Lincoln in 1863 when he set the date for celebrating a national day of Thanksgiving as the fourth Thursday in November. Of course, other generations of Americans have modified that date. President Franklin D. Roosevelt proclaimed that in 1939 the date for the celebration of Thanksgiving ought to be November 23rd. This year at least, Thanksgiving is on the fourth Thursday of November. So let's just enjoy it, and this year, give it a little more zest by celebrating it as the Pilgrims did so long ago in October of 1621 in Plymouth,

Massachusetts.

If you are going to be a purist and really celebrate the holiday as the Pilgrims did, you first have to change the name of the celebration to "Harvest Home." Apparently the Pilgrims had a festival that was more in tune with the English celebration than one that involved a day of prayer and Thanksgiving. Harvest Home was an "older mode of Thanksgiving" that was celebrated by English farmers once "the main crop was ingathered" and "it was cakes and ale and hang the cost." Those who have studied that first Thanksgiving have concluded that "Plymouth's Harvest Home conformed in most essentials to its English prototype. Partakers of Plenty: A Study of the First Thanksgiving, Plymouth Plantation Educational Publication Series, Plymouth Plantation, Plymouth, Massachusetts.)

If you opt to celebrate the holiday as the Pilgrims did, you should plan for a festival that will last approximately one week, but you can squeeze it into four days. You will need enough wild game to last for four days so it might be wise to prepare in advance and send the duck hunters out early to bring home "geese, ducks, and possibly turkeys." Governor Bradford of Plymouth Colony made sure that this was done beforehand. And during this festival, you should also plan for some "traditional recreations" that you and your guests can enjoy over the four days. You might want to include some sort of a parade, a shooting demonstration with "muskets and fowling pieces," and some athletic competition. You might consider some of the things the Pilgrims could have done in this regard: archery, track and field events or cricket. These activities would approximate some of their athletic recreations. (James Deetz and Jay Anderson, op. cit.)

The most important aspect of your celebration of Harvest Home, that of feasting, will take a little more preparation time. You don't have to be concerned about table settings and enough chairs for the guests. If you do this the way the Pilgrims must have, you can eat outside (weather permitting). "The familiar scene to which we have become accustomed, of Pilgrims and Indians feasting together while seated at tables in the open, is most certainly a creation of later artists.... It is more likely that food was taken, not at an appointed time and place, but at frequent intervals throughout the time of the festival. Seating was almost certainly on the ground.

Lacking forks..., food was taken with fingers, from the tips of knives, and with spoons. Wooden trenchers (small shallow dishes) were probably very much in evidence, while other food-stuffs could have been consumed directly from large kettles, or in

the case of meat, eaten with the hands, hot from the roasting fire."A bit messy perhaps, but it will certainly make the clean up of dishes and silverware a lot easier. (James Deetz and Jay Anderson, op. cit.)



The actual food will be a little more tricky. The main focal point of the meal will certainly have to be a "young, lean goose." This will have to be "a domesticated bird, fattened on grain stubble." You should prepare several ducks and wild turkeys to add to the repast, but the goose will be the *piece de resistance*. To supplement the goose, you might want to prepare several "flesh-pies." These would have been meat pies tucked into some kind of corn-meal pastry. You might want to make such a pie out of "old chicken, hare or pigeon meat tenderized by hours of simmering and then baking." Or if you have a deer hunter in the family, you could substitute venison as the Pilgrims surely must have done with the deer that the Indians brought to the feast. To

add to the feast, you might want to make a "frumenty pudding." This will give you trouble and require some research on how to make it, but suffice it to say that you want a pudding that will approximate old-fashioned rice pudding, only this dish will have a wheat base, spices, fruits, and sweeteners like milk and honey. The vegetable for this feast will have to be pumpkins that you can bake, stew, or make into a pudding. And to top off this feast, don't forget "the cakes and ale." The cakes are not quite what you are used to however. "The cakes were made of corn – roasted, pounded in a homemade mortar and pestle, mixed into a paste with water, and fried on a griddle into thin, crisp 'pan' cakes." To wash these "dry and crumbly" cakes down, you will need ale. You might want to homebrew a

sweet ale, but maybe at this point it would be easier to pick up some Molson's Golden Ale. (James Deetz and Jay Anderson, op. cit.)

There you have it – your own authentic Harvest Home celebration. Actually, it sounds like it would be a lot of fun. If you decide to try and recreate Thanksgiving this way, by all means call me. I could roast the meat over an open fire. Have a happy Thanksgiving (or should I say Harvest Home).



Quality Consignment Makes Quality Decorating Affordable

Over the past 40 years, I've been privileged to be taken along to different locations by my Long Island clients who have purchased second homes where I've helped them make those places "a home away from home." The most popular, Florida, has given me the opportunity to work and develop sources where I, too, have a second home. There's fun shopping, you never have to worry about snow – and that's where I was first introduced to quality consignment stores. Because the large affluent elderly population who retired there eventually expires, the generation of children who inherit furnishings that are not their taste or too large for their space, either donates the contents or sends them off to consignment stores where they are sold.

Constantly rearranging to welcome new merchandise often drives my staff a little crazy – but we're all having so much fun as new treasures arrive daily. Shoppers reaction to our efforts is always gratifying, especially now as we get ready for the holidays.

The best part is I'm shopping consignment for my own clients, as well! Saving money means we can do more. If the space plan is right and beautiful items that were once beyond the client's financial reach are now available, it's a win for everyone. NATURALLY SPEAKING: Go Natural This Holiday Season

Among other things December is a month of gift giving. Don't just think outside the box, think just outside. There are so many gift possibilities for the casual, intense, or somewhere in between gardener.

The home chef would love a well stocked herb garden. Get a gift card at your local garden center and/or from a plant catalog. Buy a book on growing herbs, a cookbook on using herbs or a book on the medical and cosmetic use of herbs. Add a trowel and good gardening gloves and use a vegetable harvest basket to hold all the items and wrap it up.

The same idea can be used for the vegetable lover. A catalog or gift card for vegetable plants and books devoted to vegetables.

You can get even more specific, think of the person that loves Italian, Greek or Indian food. Or the person that loves flowers or is a collector of certain types of plants. Maybe someone could use a whole set of new garden tools. A gardening set would be good for a child too, and add a coupon for a day that you will help the child start his garden. Think about the houseplant gardener also. So many possibilities. You can have all of your family and friends growing something. Happy



shopping.

After all the thoughts about gardening you may be itching to get outside. There are still chores you can do or may have missed doing so far. This month is probably the last chance you will have to get them done this season. Make sure your garden hoses and garden tools are put away. At the least, clean and dry tools and put them out of the wet weather.

You may want to wrap, cover or shield your favorite trees, shrubs and evergreens from the harsh effects of the winter and damage from wildlife. Some of those critters just love to munch on spring-flowering bulbs. Pin sheets of chicken wire on top of planted bulbs. Remove the wire in the spring when the bulbs start to sprout.

Make sure your perennial beds

are ready for their big sleep. Replace or add plant tags, this will prevent you from stepping on or digging up emerging plants come spring time. Pull any remaining weeds for they can still drop seeds that will be happy to sprout later on. Leave some of those perennials standing, they will provide winter interest and/or food for birds and animals. The exception is diseased plants, they should be cut down bagged and discarded. Once the plants are dormant and the ground is beginning to freeze add a thick blanket of mulch to the perennial bed. Straw or oak leaves are two good choices.

Think natural when decorating this month. Use beautiful bare branches, bright red rose hips on thorny stems, bright green pine boughs, shiny holy leaves, sap-covered pine cones, soft green moss and raspberry-colored cranberries. Sounds prettier than red and green plastic doesn't it?

Enjoy the quiet peace of the season.

Community Medicaid: Update Regarding Pooled Trusts for Married Persons

Last month I wrote about a recent New York State Department of Health regulation that requires the county departments of Social Services to instruct married recipients of Community (home-care) Medicaid that they no longer have the option of using a pooled trust for their excess income. As a result of the efforts of attorneys in the New York State Bar Association, the Department of Health has agreed that it will rescind the new regulation until the federal government's Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services provides clarification regarding the intent of the federal law (part of the Affordable Care Act) that sparked this change.

For those of you who missed my column last month, pooled trusts are a method under which a Community Medicaid recipient with "too much" money, may transfer his or her excess income each month and have household bills paid. The program is described in more detail in my article "Paying For Long Term Care At Home" on my website.

The budgeting rules that the Department of Health mandated in its regulation issued on August 5, 2014 will financially harm many married recipients of homecare Medicaid. That regulation and its effect are described



in last month's article, which can also be found on my website ("*Community Medicaid: Pooled Trusts Are No Longer Available For Married Persons*").

It is expected that sometime in November, 2014 the Department of Health will issue a new regulation rescinding the August 5, 2014 regulation, which will effectively restore the prior budgeting rules for married persons receiving managed long term care services at home under the Medicaid program. Those rules state that the Medicaid recipient has the right to choose which of two budgeting formulas is more financially beneficial to the household.

In sum, I expect that the county departments of Social Services will receive a notice from the State Department of Health during the month of November instructing them that pooled trusts are still an option for homecare Medicaid recipients if that budgeting formula is more favorable. If any married

Medicaid recipient has been told by the Department of Social Services that the pooled trust option is not available to them, please feel free to contact me.

I intend to provide updates as this issue develops.

The rules regarding Medicaid eligibility are extremely complex, and many alternatives exist. Since each particular case has its own unique facts, the reader is cautioned that the above summary cannot be considered legal advice and should consult with an appropriate legal advisor. Please also note that the monetary figures stated herein are applicable to applications filed in 2014, and might vary in later years.

PERSPECTIVES ON REAL ESTATE: Deciphering the Language of Real Estate

Every profession seems to have its own dialect. Doctors speak of EKGs and CAT scans. Electricians talk about amps, plumbers about elbows, lawyers about appurtenances. Realtors refer to the exclusive right to sell, agency relationships and ready, willing and able buyers. Often our clients and customers are left in the dark, feeling inadequate, deficient in some obscure way, and far from comfortable. When you are going to sell or purchase a house, you want to feel secure, not vulnerable. Here are some common real estate terms everyone should know.

Agency

The relationship between an agent who is hired by a "principal" to perform specific tasks. In Real estate the "principal" can be either the seller, where this relationship is defined by the contract called the listing agreement, or the buyer, where the agent is "hired," contractually, by the buyer to act on his/her behalf in the purchase of a house, land or commercial property.

Ready, Willing and Able

This phrase defines a buyer who has agreed to the seller's price and terms; is in a position to purchase in a timely manner; and who has been determined to have the financial resources (both in cash and mortgage financing) to complete the

purchase.

Exclusive Right to Sell

A listing contract of employment, between the seller and a real estate broker/agent to promote and execute the sale of real property, for an agreed upon fee when the sale closes, whether the listing agent, the owner or another broker sells the property.

Binder

This is a bit of a misnomer because although it provides an outline of the proposed sale covering the purchase price, terms and conditions of the sale, the proposed contract date and closing date, the document is NOT in fact legally binding. This is also called a "Sales Agreement" continued on page 82

which is more accurate. It is not until both the buyer and seller have signed the *contract of sale*, drawn up by the seller's attorney, and it is delivered to both parties, that there is a "binding" agreement.

Equity

The interest or value an owner has in real property over and above the mortgage owed, or other liens.

Foreclosure

In the event a buyer fails to pay or otherwise defaults on the terms of the agreement outlined in the loan/mortgage, the mortgage holder (most often the bank) will sell the property (the security for the loan) to pay the debt.

Home Equity Loan

A loan, also referred to as a line of credit, where the collateral for the loan is the residential property. The owner can withdraw funds up to an agreed upon amount. This is often called a "piggy back" loan because it is in second position to the original mortgage. The amount of the equity the owner has in the house is one of the determining factors in securing this loan. It can be used for improvements to the dwelling and other purchases.

Lis Pendens

A recorded legal document essentially giving notice that an action against a property has been filed in court (e.g. a mechanics lien, mortgage default).

Personal Property

Long called "chattel," personal

property refers to items which do not pertain to real property (the house), and are things which can be moved. This could include window treatments, lighting fixtures (which must be replaced) or a generator. These items are listed on the listing agreement so that the buyer is not "surprised" by what does not "come with the house."

Comparative Market Analysis (CMA)

A report provided by a real estate professional/agent to help the seller determine the current market value of the home. Comparable sales, active listings (the competition), and homes which failed to sell ("expireds") are included in the analysis to arrive at a reasonable expectation of the selling price.

Plantar Fasciitis

If the first few steps you take in the morning cause significant pain in the bottom of your foot or heel, you may be very familiar with this condition.

The plantar fascia is the connective tissue that runs from your heel to the base of the toes. Inflammation of this fascia is known as plantar fasciitis and this condition affects nearly two million people in the United States annually. Most often seen in middle-aged people it is painful and debilitating and is the most common cause of heel pain. This type of injury can be a long challenging process to treat.

Sudden trauma, improper footwear, strenuous activity and obesity can lead to chronic degenerative weakening and inflammation of the fascia.

Patients frequently describe the discomfort as a sharp stab or deep ache at the bottom of the heel that extends along the un-

dersurface of the foot. Most often, the pain occurs in the morning upon waking and taking the first few steps out of bed. With non-weight bearing or inactivity the fascia under the foot naturally shortens and tightens. Upon weight bearing the fascia becomes stretched, inflamed and can cause tears to form. With chronic tensile stress of the fascia, the point of attachment to the heel gets irritated and the body responds with depositing calcium which forms a bony outgrowth known as a heel spur. This can cause sharp pain at the heel and significantly interfere with walking. If plantar fasciitis goes untreated, you may find it hard to keep up with your level of activity and may develop knee, hip and back problems due to an altered gait.

Initial treatment is focused on decreasing the inflammation and relieving the stress to the fascia. Over the counter inserts



can support the arch and be beneficial, but depending on individual needs a custom insert may be required especially if dealing with a heel spur. Specific chiropractic adjustments of the bones in the foot can be of benefit by helping relieve the unnecessary stress applied to the fascia from a misaligned joint. Stretching of the calves and plantar fascia is the cornerstone of treatment and consistently will be needed to be maintained in order to help reduce the chance of recurrence.

Yipes! IPO Hype Can Lead to Risky Investing

All investors probably wish they had gotten in on the "ground floor" of Apple or Microsoft or any other big success story. And, in fact, you can indeed "be there from the beginning" by taking part in a company's initial public offering (IPO). However, the ground floor of many IPOs may be shakier than you'd think – and might not provide you with the solid footing you need to invest wisely.

Of course, not all IPOs are the same. Many large, profitable companies, seeking to raise capital, have gone public in recent years through IPOs. However, IPOs of newer, unproven companies share some characteristics that should give pause to serious, long-term investors. Consider the following:

• **Hype**

Let's face it: A big part of the appeal of IPOs is the "wow" factor. It looks really cool when the company's CEO – or perhaps a visiting celebrity – rings the opening bell at the New York Stock Exchange. And the rush to buy shares in the now-public company always garners big headlines. Yet "hype" is just one letter removed from "hope" – and hope alone is not a good reason to invest. Furthermore, no single stock – even one that



might have strong growth potential – is likely going to be the ticket to investment success.

• **Lack of track record**

By definition, newer companies that launch IPOs don't have long track records. And while it's true that "past performance can't predict future results," it's nonetheless useful to see how a stock has performed in various economic climates and how the company management has responded to different challenges over time.

• **Exceptional volatility**

All stocks fluctuate in value. But IPOs tend to be especially volatile – not just in their first few days of trading but also in their first few years of availability to the public.

• **Higher risk potential**

Generally, IPOs of newer companies are better suited for aggressive investors – those who can handle a higher degree of

risk in exchange for potentially higher returns.

• **Nonstandard accounting**

Some IPOs, particularly Internet start-ups, use nonstandard, or "customized," accounting measures to depict their companies in the best possible light. While these measures are not illegal – and in some cases, may even be useful in illuminating a company's performance – they tend, overall, to make it more difficult for potential investors to accurately evaluate a business' profitability, or at least potential profitability. At the end of the day, good old-fashioned profits and cash flow are still the key driver of companies' stock prices.

As an alternative to pursuing an IPO, you could use any extra "investable" money you may have to fill gaps in your current portfolio, based on your goals. Or, if you are truly attracted to the type of business in which an IPO is involved, you might want to consider investing in a more established company in the same industry.

Taking part in an IPO sounds fun and exciting. But as we've seen, IPOs can have some serious drawbacks. And while it may not sound glamorous, a steady approach to investing – one that involves diversification, respon-

Rock Concerts Puts Teens' Hearing at Risk

Exposure to loud music at a rock concert often results in temporary hearing loss for teenagers, researchers say. A study by the House Research Institute revealed that 72% of teens reported reduced hearing after attending a three-hour show. This type of hearing loss typically disappears within 48 hours, but if it occurs repeatedly, permanent hearing loss can develop, the study authors noted.

Teenagers need to understand a single exposure to loud noise either from a concert or personal listening device can lead to hearing loss. With multiple exposures to noise over 85 decibels, the tiny hair cells may stop functioning and the hearing loss may be permanent.

For the study, researchers offered 29 teenagers free tickets to a rock concert. All of the seats were about 15 to 18 rows away from the stage.

Beforehand, the kids were told how they could protect their hearing and were encouraged to use foam ear plugs during the performance. Only three chose to use them.

Using a calibrated sound pressure meter, researchers seated with the teens found that sound decibel levels (dB) ranged from 82 to 110 dB and averaged 98.5 dB. The average was greater than 100 dB for 10 of the 26 songs played.

It was noted that these levels

exceeded the workplace safety standards of the US Occupational Safety and Health Administration, (OSHA), which sets time limits on exposure to sound levels of 85 dB or greater.

Following the concert, most of the teens had a significant reduction in the Distortion Product Otoacoustic Emissions Test, which checks the function of cells in the inner ear. These cells are critical to normal hearing and most vulnerable to damage from prolonged noise exposure.

Specifically, 53.6% of the teens said they were not hearing as well as they did before the concert, and 25% reported tinnitus, which is ringing in the ears.

Although these cells usually recover, the researchers cautioned that repeated exposure to loud noise could permanently damage hearing.

The authors said more research is needed to determine if teenage ears are more sensitive than adult ears. Guidelines for noise exposure among teenagers may need to be updated.

"It also means we definitely need to be doing more to ensure the sound levels at concerts are not so loud as to cause hearing loss and neurological damage in teenagers, as well as adults," said study lead author Dr. M. Jennifer Derebery, physician at the House Clinic. "Only three of our 29 teens chose to use ear protection, even when it was given to them

and they were encouraged to do so. We have to assume this is typical behavior for most teen listeners, so we have the responsibility to get the sound levels down to safer levels."

The researchers pointed out that teenagers should take advantage of sound meter "apps" available for smart phones, which provide an estimate of surrounding noise level, and use ear protection when appropriate.

Our young people are at risk more than you can imagine. Every day, environmental sounds that we are exposed to exceed levels that are considered to be safe; we have little control over that aspect, however we do have personal control over where we go, and if in fact there is loud noise exposure in the setting we are in, one should recognize it and protect him/herself in the form of ear protection. Ear protection is quite inexpensive, from foam types to custom plugs that baffle sound at selected dB levels chosen by the user. For as little as a few dollars you can preserve much of your hearing that would normally be at risk.

Pay Attention to Your Muscles – Stretch

By paying attention to our body and especially your muscles, you can avoid needless injuries.

Stretching muscles properly before participating in any sport is imperative to the overall health of the muscle. It will also enhance speed, balance, strength, endurance and agility. Stretching several times per week can help

reduce muscle tension, enhance coordination and increase range of motion.

The overall benefits of toned muscles are numerous. From a chiropractic view point, by keeping para-spinal muscle in tone, you can strengthen your spine and maintain your adjustments more effectively. Other substantial benefits of stretching is to promote circulation – it will increase blood flow creating more flexibility, thus decreasing the risk of injury.

Harbor Country Day School Students Visit Nissequogue River

Innovative program allows students to explore and contribute to study of river

On October 15, 2014 more than 75 students from Harbor Country Day School in St. James, participated in "A Day in the Life of the Nissequogue River." Sponsored by the Central Pine Barrens Commission, Brookhaven National Labs and the NY Dept. of Environmental Conservation, the "Day in the Life" program brings students to Long Island's major river systems in order to engage in hands-on exploration and analysis of one of the region's precious natural resources.

During their visit, Harbor students from 3rd through 8th grade caught and studied more than 1,400 fish, collected and analyzed water samples to monitor water quality, conducted a physical analysis of the weather, current, and tides affecting the river, and conducted a site analysis of the river's rocks, minerals and other characteristics.

All data the students collected is made public and is used for various environmental purposes, including tracking the health of the Nissequogue River from year-to-year. In addition, the program raises awareness among children about the importance of protecting and restoring Long Island's

aquatic ecosystems, as water quality issues continue to permeate Long Island.

"We were thrilled to have the opportunity to participate in this incredible program," said John Cissel, Head of School for Harbor Country Day School. "The hands-on understanding the children develop from activities like this is something that stays with them throughout their lives. Their experience on the River goes far beyond simply reading about Long Island's environment it brings the issues home to them in such a way that they have a far deeper appreciation for all of

Long Island's natural resources, including the Nissequogue River, and are becoming stewards of our natural resources."

The visit was part of a comprehensive program wherein students from 35 schools and 26 school districts across Long Island explored three of Long Island's four major river systems. Harbor Country Day School students were the only elementary-aged students to participate in the Nissequogue River program.


