Yes, when we rescued these dogs, we did not know that Shampoo was EXPECTING, and on Wednesday she gave birth to one healthy little puppy that we have named *Surprise*. Thankfully for Shampoo, she was in our care. We are happy to report that both mom and pup are doing very well. Needless to say, the 33 dogs we thought we had rescued have actually turned out to be 34.

Matt is flourishing in his new home! *Shampoo* nestles with her newborn baby after giving birth. *Moondog* is one of the many still

in our care.

Thank you again from the bottom of our hearts! We shudder at the thought of what would have happened to *Shampoo* and her baby, as well as the other dogs that were fortunate to end up in our care.

DESIGN IDEAS:

Organized Space – That New Frontier

NATURALLY SPEAKING: Fall Season is Upon Us

With the leaves off of the trees and the perennial and annual plants fading away, it is a good time to take stock of your garden landscape. You can really see the *bones* of your garden, the landscape pieces that do not change from season to season. There may be plants that should be moved to a better spot. Life Insurance: It's for the People Who Live

Life insurance is a practical way to protect your family's financial hopes and dreams. The death of a family member can be devastating to survivors both emotionally and financially. Life insurance can provide cash to help with your

family's immediate and long-term needs.

Immediate needs include funeral expenses, unpaid medical bills and taxes.

Long-term needs include care for a disabled child or elderly parent expenses and, in general, the

chance for members of your family to continue to live the life to which they are accustomed.

Life insurance is not for the people who die, but for people who live. It's wise to explore options while you are still healthy; health problems can make life insurance expensive or unavailable. Three forms of life insurance are most common today

Term life insurance

This is temporary life insurance for a specific time period (one, five, 10 or more years). It can provide short-term coverage on a limited budget. Term insurance, however, costs more to buy as you get older.

There are two common types of term life insurance:

- *Level term*: the amount of protection remains the same during the coverage period.
- *Decreasing term*: the amount of protection gradually declines during the coverage period.

Whole life insurance

Premiums are generally level with cash value growth throughout the life of the policy.

- Cash values can be borrowed (with interest charged) during the insured person's lifetime to help meet temporary or emergency needs.
- Funds borrowed reduce the death benefit and cash surrender value.

Universal life insurance

This offers many traditional advantages of whole life insurance (such as protection for life), but also offers flexibility. Coverage amounts and premium payments are flexible to help meet changing needs during an insured person's lifetime (subject to certain conditions).

When you buy life insurance, you buy a promise of protection against financial loss caused by death. The promise is only as continued on page 110

HEALTH VIEWS:

October is Spinal Health Month

Many of us go through each day typing on a computer, bending or lifting items, gardening, taking care of our children and playing sports. If not done properly, these activities can cause pain or injury which may become chronic if left untreated. Back pain is pervasive in our society. Eighty percent of us will suffer from it at some point in our lives, and fifty percent of us will suffer from back pain this year alone. Low-back pain is the most common work complaint experienced by Americans today.

Because of the importance of taking care of the back and spine, the American Chiropractic Association (ACA) recognizes the month of October as a national observation for Spinal Health.

It is important to recognize maintenance of the spine, as the central nervous system originates in the brain and channels down through the spinal column, extending to every part of the body. A misalignment of the vertebrae of the spine may result in nerve interference, resulting in headaches, low-back and neck pain, among other problems.

Listen to your body. Use preven-

tive measures at work and at home. The following tips can help reduce the risk of spinal injury.

While at the office, remember to take frequent stretch breaks while working on your computer.

While working on your computer, sit with your knees at approximately a 90- to 120-degree angle. Using an angled footrest to support your feet may help you sit more comfortably.

Make sure your chair fits correctly. Allow for two inches between the front edge of the seat and the back of your knees. The chair should tilt back so you can rest while your reading what is on your computer screen.

Avoid twisting and turning motions. Always bend from the knees, not your waist, when lifting anything heavier than 10 percent of your body weight, such as a child or a heavy box.

Warm up and stretch before any physical activity, including all sports, raking, gardening and shoveling snow. Be aware of your body form and technique; stand as erect as possible and let your legs and arms do the work, not your back. Allow your body and muscles time to cool



down after such an activity.

It is important to get a good night's rest. Choose a comfortable supportive mattress as well as a pillow that supports the weight of your head, reducing the risk of back or neck pain.

The key to spinal health is prevention; listen to your body's warning signals and adjust your lifestyle. If you do experience pain for more than one or two days despite using these preventive measures, consult a professional.

It's No Treat to Be Tricked by Scary Investment Moves

If you have young children, or even if you just have some in your neighborhood, you know they will soon acquire large amounts of free candy, obtained by impersonating witches, vampires and other scary creatures. As an adult, of course, you're unlikely to encounter too many monsters after Halloween ends. Yet as you go through life, you will find some things that are truly alarming – such as scary investment moves.

Here are a few of these frightful actions:

• **Investing too conservatively**

You could try to avoid investment risk by putting all your money into very conservative investments. However, as you're probably aware, those invest-



ments typically pay very little in the way of interest, so your money could actually lose purchasing power, even with a mild rate of inflation.

• **Investing too aggressively**

Just as investing too conservatively can be counterproductive, so can investing too aggressively.

Obviously, you would like your money to grow, but the investments with the highest growth potential are usually also those that carry the greatest risk to your principal.

• **Putting too much money in too few investments**

If you put too many of your investment dollars into just one or two types of assets, and a downturn hits those assets, your portfolio will probably take a big hit.

- **Taking a "timeout" from investing**

During periods of significant market volatility, such as we've seen the past few years, you might be tempted to take a "timeout" from investing and stick all your money into very conservative vehicles until everything "blows over." But the financial markets will never be totally calm, nor will they be predictable. Market rallies can start unexpectedly; if you're not invested when that happens, you may miss out on growth opportunities.

- **Ignoring tax-advantaged investment opportunities**

When you invest in a tax-deferred investment account, such as your 401(k) and a traditional IRA, your money has the opportu-

nity to grow faster than it would if it were placed in an investment on which you paid taxes every year. If you aren't contributing to your 401(k) and you haven't opened an IRA, you're missing out on a great chance to build resources for retirement.

To make sure you don't fall victim to these scary investment moves, you need only follow a few simple principles. First, take the long view – you will see ups and downs in the short term, but historically the market has performed well over the long term. (Keep in mind, though, that past performance is not guarantee of what will happen in the future.) Second, diversify your holdings among a variety of investments. Diversification, by itself, cannot guarantee a profit or protect against loss, but it can help re-

duce the effects of volatility. Try to build a diversified portfolio based on your risk tolerance, time horizon and long-term goals. And finally, consider boosting your 401(k) contributions whenever your salary increases and fully funding your IRA each year.

Halloween comes but once a year, but scary investment moves can haunt you for a lifetime – so take the right steps to help avoid them.

Pour Over Will

Many individuals choose to transfer all of their assets to a trust of which the individual is the sole trustee. One reason to do so is to have all of their assets on death pass to their beneficiaries without the need to probate a will. However, over the years following the creation of the trust, it is not uncommon that those individuals would obtain additional assets which, for one reason or another, are not transferred to the trust.

Under those circumstances said assets would not be in the trust at the time of the individual's death. In that case, if the individual dies without a will, those additional assets would be distributed to the heirs pursuant to New York State law. If the individual leaves a spouse and children, for instance, the laws of intestacy would dis-

tribute the assets between a surviving spouse and the individual's children.

Since the trust is intended to be the document that effectuates the transfer of the individual's assets on death, the pour over will would provide that upon the individual's death all assets owned by the individual in his/her name are transferred from the individual's estate to the trust. In that way the individual's estate plan would be effectuated.

The pour over will is a back-up. If all of the assets are in the trust as of the time of the individual's death, the pour over will would not be probated. Since most wills are not probated for many years after the will has been executed, it is likely that other assets could be obtained by the individual which were not transferred to the

trust. In that case, the pour over will would transfer any assets which are not in the trust into the trust after the death of such individual such that the wishes of the individual upon his/her death as set forth in the trust would be accomplished.



Thinking of Medicaid? What About the House?

You (or a loved one) need help. Activities of daily living are becoming difficult – maybe impossible – without it. These concerns may have hit suddenly or perhaps you could see them coming for some time. In any case, there is no long term insurance to pay for the care needed and it looks like you don't have the money to pay for a home health aide. Or even if you do, you would rather have Medicaid pay for your care. On top of that, despite everyone's best efforts, a nursing home might be needed in the future. What do you do?

A home health aide can cost between \$2,000 and \$12,000 each month depending upon how many hours of care are given. Nursing home care costs at least \$10,000 monthly.

Long term care planning definitely is not "one size fits all." Individual health and functional concerns, assets (and types of assets), income, marital status, family and support network (and faith in their abilities, inclination to help and trustworthiness) all are important considerations. So are projections of likely medical and functional status, wealth and support network some years down the road. And so, of course, are your desires. The best plan in the world is no good if you are not comfortable with it.

I frequently am consulted by clients who were told to "give it all away so you could be eligible for Medicaid coverage." While it is true that Medicaid is for "poor people," sometimes these clients are having second thoughts. Sometimes their second thoughts have come too late. They already gave it all away and are in desperate need of care, but are ineligible for Medicaid.

Often a Medicaid application is denied because of failure to provide all documentation requested. I will address that problem in a future article. Suffice it to say "keep your records."

In considering how to provide for long term care, if Medicaid is the goal, a very significant distinction exists between care at home or assisted living and care in a "skilled nursing facility" (nursing home). The law in New York allows you to become eligible for home care Medicaid in the month after you transfer virtually all of your property as gifts (subject to income qualification). Whether the property is given to individuals or under a properly written irrevocable trust doesn't matter.

On the other hand, when a Medicaid application is made for coverage in a nursing home, you will be ineligible for coverage if you gave away any property during the five years before the

month for which you seek coverage. The length of time that you will be ineligible depends on how much you gave away. The more you gave away, the longer the "penalty" period. For example, if you gave away \$100,000 within the last five years, you will be ineligible for nursing home coverage for almost nine months – beginning when you apply.

How, then, do we decide what to do? First, if you have a spouse, gifts to him or her will not result in a penalty. A gift of the house to certain other limited people also will not result in a penalty. Those people are: (1) a minor child, (2) a disabled or blind child of any age, (3) an adult child who has lived in the home with the parent as a care-giver for at least two years before the parent enters the nursing home, and (4) a sibling of the applicant who has resided in the home for at least one year before the applicant enters the nursing home and who has an "equity interest" in the home. However, most people do not have circumstances that allow for these limited exceptions; Often, even if they do, it is just not the right solution. For the majority of people considering Medicaid planning, a transfer of the house to a trust is the most logical solution.



The most common asset I see among my clients that they could afford to transfer is their home. Whether the transfer is to a properly written irrevocable income-only trust, or to family members while keeping a "life estate," depends on the circumstances. If the client states unequivocally that 1) the home will not be sold until after his or her death, 2) the client will never need any money from the home (by mortgaging it) and 3) the people who are to be the "remainder owners" on the deed will certainly transfer it back if requested, this client might benefit from a "life estate deed."

However, more commonly, clients can not state all this with certainty. They would better be served in Medicaid planning by a transfer of the house to a properly written irrevocable trust. Under the terms of this trust, they can't be kicked out or charged rent. They keep their property tax exemptions (as with a life estate). They also could tell

their trusted trustee to sell the house and buy another one for their benefit. Or buy a condo. Or keep all the money from the sale in the trust and pay rent for an apartment or assisted living. Any income the trust property earns belongs to the client.

As opposed to giving away money and/or other investments (which might pinch your pocketbook before five years runs out), transferring the house often is a sensible way to plan. Of course, if it looks like you will have to go a nursing home within five years after a house is transferred, you should be sure you have a way to pay for the nursing home during the balance of the five years. Making a Medicaid application within the five years would result in a penalty. The length of the penalty would be based on the value of your house! A big mistake.

Medicaid eligibility is often a concern for most people. However, the "big picture" requires that all ramifications of your action be considered. Simply put:

whether you are married or single, Medicaid eligibility has to be looked at in the context of your entire circumstances. Don't do something just because your neighbor or friend did. Get good advice.

Note:

The rules regarding nursing home Medicaid eligibility are extremely complex, and many alternatives exist. Since each particular case has its own unique facts, the reader is cautioned that the above summary can not be considered legal advice and should consult with an appropriate legal advisor. Please also note that the monetary figures stated herein are applicable to applications filed in 2010, and might vary in later years.

Debunking the Myth of Dental Insurance

In these difficult financial times there still remains a bright light at the end of the tunnel. Many people who have worked diligently their entire lives have either not used their dental insurance benefits or at best only a fraction of the available coverages. These benefits tend to be given on an annual basis, and as such many expire unused during the coverage period. Your dentist should make every effort to research and verify levels of available coverage, and with that information they develop a treatment plan which incorporates those benefits to the maximum. Although the insurance may not cover 100% of the needed services, they will endeavor to present those alternatives which best make use of your coverage.

Many people do not understand the difference between a participating dentist and a non-participating dentist. Some of the plans enter into a contract with a dentist where in the dentist accepts a lesser amount for the serv-



ices. Your dentist should have examined most plans and determined which plans they are able to participate with and still be able to deliver the highest quality services to you. In those cases where the insurance coverage is below the minimum they should offer a reduced rate for the difference, and in most cases look for a financing option to pay for it. As for those plans which they do not participate with directly, they should be willing to send in a pre estimate, and upon receipt of the predetermination of benefits, which is essentially what your insurance company is willing to pay, accept the benefit coverage and determine if there is additional monies needed from you to deliver the services. What this

means is that you do not have to pay and wait for the money, you are permitted to assign the benefit to them and only pay the difference if there is one.

In my opinion, a great practice to adopt, is to call the dental office which you may have been referred to by a friend or co-worker, question them as to the plans which they currently participate in, and question as to their willingness to work with those plans which they may not be currently involved with. In addition, you should also inquire about financing options, as sometimes dentistry becomes quite costly. Once you have found an office, go by for an informal visit. While there, ask to meet the dentist, look for cleanliness, look for state-of-the-art equipment and ask the patients in the waiting room how they like the office.

HEALTH NOTES

Key to Feeling Great

by Dr. Linda M. Bocchichio

Your spine allows you to do almost everything you do. Proper spinal function allows you to do things well and most of the time, pain-free. Poor spinal function forces you to do things poorly or not at all. Almost every movement you make from getting out of bed in the morning until you get back into bed at night, requires your spine to work in very complex ways that you've probably never thought about. Not only does your spine perform delicate mechanical functions, but it also facilitates the majority of your nerve function – another aspect of proper spinal function that most people never consider.

When you move, your spinal column moves in some combination of four ways:

- Flexion – bending forward
- Extension – bending backward

- Lateral bending – bending from side to side
- Rotation – twisting

Your spinal column can twist and bend to accommodate your every activity. This is accomplished by each spinal segment doing its job. When your spine moves, each movement of your vertebrae is choreographed through the rest of your body via a wonderfully designed system of muscles and ligaments that work together.

Your spine also has 31 pairs of spinal nerves that exit at some point from your spinal column. These delicate spinal nerves can become irritated, or inflammation can occur, when your spine fails to function properly. These irritations or inflammation are thought to impact the nerve flow to the vital organs throughout your body.

In a healthy spine each vertebra

moves just a little each time you bend or twist. Even when you use your arms and legs, your spine plays a role. When you walk, your spine rotates just enough to allow your feet to move forward without tripping on the ground. The nerves inside and around your spine are protected and function comfortably when your vertebrae move within their normal range. Should one or more of your vertebrae fail to move (hypomobility) other vertebrae would have to move more than they should (hypermobility) in order to compensate and still allow your body to perform the function it needs. When this happens, the muscles and ligaments connected to your spine can become fatigued and cause you pain.

This abnormal movement of your vertebrae will also cause continued on page 110





Local merchants, politicians and organizations joined the festivities offering special sales, demonstrations, raffles and drawings, informational brochures... just about anything you can imagine?


There was, of course, food galore... and entertainment throughout the day which included live music, dance and martial arts demonstrations, sand art, bal-

Every year, children look forward to Halloween trick-or-treating. To ensure your child's safety, here are some tips to consider.

The more boxes you can check off, the more you'll ensure a safe, happy Halloween for your child.

- It's short enough to avoid tripping my child.

lengthwise, and 5 cups of water in a saucepan. Bring to a boil. When berries begin to burst, about 5 minutes, reduce heat to low. Cook, stirring, 10 minutes more. Let cool some then pour through a strainer into a pitcher, pressing with the back of a spoon. Refrigerate covered for up to a week.

There are some chores left to do outside too. Clean up and put away any plant stakes, tools and clay pots. If you haven't already done so, clean up the garden beds, turn over the soil and add some compost.

Make that last trip to the farm stand for fresh, local produce for your Thanksgiving dinner. Use all those leftover vegetables to make a hearty vegetable soup to welcome in chilly (and busy) December.

Pumpkin Cookies a Palate Pleaser for Halloween Fun

Halloween parties are a staple of many late October social calendars. While the days leading up to Halloween are often spent working on the perfect costume, Halloween party hosts also must find the right foods to put guests in that Halloween mood. And when it comes to Halloween cuisine, no food is more on the mind than pumpkin. Halloween hosts hoping to please their guests' palates should consider the following recipe for "Pumpkin Cookies With Cream Cheese Frosting," courtesy of the Food Network.

**Pumpkin Cookies
With Cream Cheese Frosting**
Makes approximately
3 dozen cookies

For the cookies:

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 sticks unsalted butter, softened

- 2 tablespoons Maple syrup
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup canned pumpkin
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground all spice
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
- Pinch ground cloves
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- Pinch of salt

For the Frosting:

- 2 (8-ounce) packages cream cheese
- 1 cup confectioners sugar
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon vanilla extract
- Zest of one lemon

For Garnish:

Whole pecans

Preheat the oven to 350° F.

In a mixer, fitted with a paddle, cream the sugar and the butter until light and fluffy. Add the maple syrup and eggs. Mix to incorporate. Add the pumpkin and mix to incorporate. Sift together the flour, baking powder, salt, cinnamon, allspice, nutmeg and cloves. Add the dry ingredients to the batter and mix well. Drop rounded tablespoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheets. Bake for 10 minutes, or until lightly golden brown around the edges. Cool on racks. When cool, ice with the cream cheese frosting.

For the Frosting: In a mixer, fitted with a paddle, add the cream cheese. Beat until light and fluffy. Beat in the powdered sugar until smooth. Add milk and vanilla. Beat until smooth. If frosting is too thick, thin with a little more milk. Fold in the lemon zest. When cookies are cool spread with some of the frosting. Garnish with a whole pecan.

Pudding With a Pumpkin Twist

Few things are more synonymous with Halloween than pumpkins. While many people instantly think of Jack-O-Lanterns when the Halloween talk veers toward those orange gourds, pumpkins can also be a big part of Halloween cuisine.

Such is the case with the following recipe for "Ain't Sug's Punkin' Puddin'" from Patty Pinner's "Sweets: Soul Food Desserts & Memories" (Ten Speed Press).

Ain't Sug's Punkin' Puddin'
Serves 4 to 6

Pudding

- 4 cups canned pumpkin
- 1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
- 2 cups evaporated milk
- 3 egg yolks
- 3 rounded tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 3 tablespoons unsalted butter, softened

Meringue

- 3 egg whites
- 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup granulated sugar

Preheat the oven to 350 F. Lightly grease a 9 by 13-inch baking pan. Set it aside.

To make the pudding, in a large bowl, combine the pumpkin, sugar, and milk. Mix until the ingredients are well combined and the pumpkin mixture is smooth. Add the egg yolks, flour, baking powder, ginger, cloves, cinnamon, and vanilla extract to the mixture. Mix well. Pour the pudding into the pre-

pared pan. Dot with the butter. Bake for 30 to 45 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean. Remove from the oven, but do not turn the oven off.

To make the meringue, in a large bowl, beat the egg whites, cream of tartar, and vanilla extract until soft peaks form. Gradually add the sugar while beating until stiff peaks form. Using your fingers, touch the meringue to make sure that some sugar grains can still be felt in the meringue. Spread the meringue on top of the cooked pudding that has just been removed from the oven, then return it to the oven and bake until the meringue is lightly browned, about 12 to 15 minutes. Turn the oven off and let the pudding stand inside the oven until the meringue is crisp. Remove it from the oven and serve hot.


