

paper forward. It is now the responsibility of the Chamber of Commerce to continue this tradition. Fortunately we have a secret weapon!!! Robin Clark has agreed to continue working with the paper so we can be assured the quality will not suffer one bit! Thank you Robin for agreeing to help us get the Our Town Newspaper back in the hands of our town.

The paper will now be run as a not-for-profit organization. We appreciate the early support we have seen by the community and hope to serve Saint James for years and years to come.

Thank you again for the extreme generosity exhibited by Ruth Garthe, Bill Garthe and Robin Clark. You all helped to make the community of Saint James such a special place.

On Tuesday, April 8, Celebrate St. James' installation of officers by Smithtown Councilwoman Lynne Nowick was a happening! With deserts provided by Garguilo Bakery and Dirty Cheesecake, tulips in bud vases by Lake Avenue Florist and background music by Lou Mazzaferro, the event was well received by

the large crowd of attendees. The new administration is tasked with continuing the mission of Celebrate St. James to "preserve and celebrate St. James' rich history and inspire an appreciation and knowledge of the arts in our community" as well as raising funds to turn the former Calderone Theatre into the St. James Community Cultural Arts Center,

Theatre and Plaza.

On December 20, this past year, through Suffolk County grant funding given to the town of Smithtown, the town was able to purchase this historic building. This project began with the installation in March of a lift/elevator funded by a jumpS-MART grant. Local Legends - Mayor Richard Bull Smith

In a township where history is woven into its very fabric, the past and present have converged in a very special way. Our Town had the pleasure of sitting down with Nissequoge Mayor Richard Bull Smith, who also has the distinction of being the newly appointed Town Historian for Smithtown.

Mayor Smith is a direct descendent of the first Richard Bull Smith who arrived in America in 1635 and founded Smithtown in 1665. He is also the ninth descendent to be named after him.

As the Town Historian he is now in the unique position of preserving the very story that began with his own ancestor. As he balances the responsibilities of governance with the duty of remembrance, his journey has certainly been an exciting one.

Richard Smith was born at

Mather Hospital in Port Jefferson and spent most of his childhood in Nissequogue. He attended Sts. Philip and James Catholic School until eighth grade, a time which he remembers fondly, "That school and the values it taught me really laid the foundation of my life." Though he planned to attend Saint Anthony's High School, his family relocated upstate.

"My father was the Suffolk County Civil Defense Director and was named to that position by the first County Executive H. Lee Dennison. He held that position for years and there was a need for him at the state level."

Despite the move, they would return frequently to see their family and friends that remained in the area.

Richard returned to Nissequogue permanently in 1983 at the age of continued on page 26

continued from page 24 29, with the rest of his family following shortly thereafter.

"We never lost track of this area," he said. "We loved Smithtown and even while away we always stayed connected. We always got the Smithtown News."

Now in his 25th year as Mayor, Richard says his political aspirations started early. At just seven years old he took part in the unveiling of a monument at Smithtown Presbyterian Church – the town's first church – when he thought it might be nice to one day be Mayor like his father and do his part in keeping Nissequogue a beautiful place.


His father, Mayor Ned Smith, had a great impact on him and he ended up realizing that dream. He credits his father, along with his Uncle R.B. Smith, eighth of his name, and cousin Malcom Smith for being his greatest influences and

major figures in his life.

Sometimes, being the direct descendent of the town's founder has its perks. In 1965, during Smithtown's 300th anniversary, ten-yearold Richard was invited to ride a live bull down Main Street in the celebratory parade. "I was so excited. They brought the bull in from Kings Dairy in Elwood. A big black and white Holstein with two farm hands guiding it by the nose ring. When we got to the staging area, my mother took one look at the size of the bull, and she said, "You are walking! You are not getting up on that!" So Richard, clad in his full colonial garb had to settle for walking alongside the bull – a memory he treasures to this day.

Among his proudest accomplishments as Mayor is working alongside the dedicated team in the Village of Nissequogue.

"We have a great team of qualified people who focus on public safety and making life as enjoyable as possible for the village residents and guests. It doesn't happen by accident. A lot of work goes in behind the scenes."

He also takes great pride in being a 41-year member of the Nissequogue Fire Department.

"We are a small village, but the fact that we have such an energetic Fire Department of very qualified firefighters and ambulance personnel is remarkable and a real testimony to the spirit of volunteerism."

Under his leadership, the Village Hall and Firehouse underwent much needed expansions – all without raising taxes. It's a testament to both fiscal responsibility and cooperative governance, though Richard is quick to credit

the people around him and believes it to be a group effort of commitment to safety, community and quality of life.

Now, as Town Historian, Richard steps into the very big shoes of his good friend Brad Harris, a professional historian and former history teacher who held the position for 47 years.

"I'll never be able to do the job that Brad did, but I will do my best. It's quite an honor and I have a great affinity for not only local history but national history as well."

Richard receives requests from all over, even other states, from people who have links to Smithtown and want to learn more about their family history. He helps people reconnect with their past in a most rewarding way and has made some unexpected discoveries in history that have delighted the folks wanting to learn more about their ances-

tors.

When asked what the most special historical moment for Smithtown was, he doesn't hesitate.

"The expansion of the railroad! It brought the world to Smithtown and Saint James. It was the single most transformative event in the town's history. Before that there would be days – long buggy trips or ferry rides to get to New York City. When the railroad arrived in 1872, Smithtown Township was transformed. Prior to that, it had been a fairly isolated and self-sufficient farming community."

As the town's historian there are things he wished everyone knew about Smithtown.

"If people only knew the horrors of the British Occupation after the Battle of Long Island. The British were spread out across the eastern seaboard, but it was the atrocities

that occurred specifically in Smithtown that led directly to the formation of the first 8 articles of the US Constitution. All are a direct bearing and result of the occupation on Long Island where it was the most severe. Most of the eligible young men had fled to Connecticut shore and would come back to engage in guerilla raids. It was the old men and women and children who suffered greatly. The British would break in and take all provisions. The occupation was a particularly hard time for Long Island. Survival was a miracle. Smithtown lived it."

Looking ahead to the 250-year anniversary of the United States next year, Richard and the Smithtown Township Historical Advisory Committee are planning town wide events he hopes will be entertaining as well as illustrative of our town's history to celebrate this event. He is working on having a play created for one of the local theaters depicting the British Occupation. In addition, they are looking to stage a recreation of the Battle of Fort Salonga with Callahan's Beach as a possible location. A townwide art contest with a Revolutionary theme is also being planned.

Even beyond his official roles, Richard's dedication spans other facets of community life. Strengthening his civic bonds even further, he is on the board of the Smithtown Historical Society, is a longtime member of the Rotary Club, and is also on the Executive Board for the Suffolk Count Village Officials Association. But what he really likes to do is get out in front of school kids to talk about the history of Long Island and specifically Smithtown, from its Native American roots up to the present. He feels educating the young kids may spark an interest in them to one day become involved in supporting the town and its local history.

And yet, for all he knows, there are still questions from the past that leave him wanting for answers.

Asked what he would ask his ancestor if given the chance, "I would want to know what community in England he came from and who his parents were. The original Richard Bull Smith was thought to come from Yorkshire, but it is not known what community he hailed from. If I

knew I would get right on a plane and go over there to research him and his family further. He was born in 1613 and, in all likelihood, he was a the second, third or fourth son. At that time in England the first son would inherit everything. The continued on page 53



An Adventure Aboard the Fulmar Sailboat

Ralph Fiorillo, born in 1934 in Brooklyn, NY moved to Saint James with his family in the early 1950's while attending Adelphi University and NYU. As a summer job, Ralph headed up the Town of Śmithtown lifeguard program for all the town beaches. After meeting his late wife, Joan, of Queens, in the pool at Adelphi they decided to marry after college and settle in St. James to raise their family. Retired from the Fire and Safety Industry, Ralph always had a passion for exploration and travel. Ralph currently lives in Bonita Springs, Florida and stays active with tennis three times a week, biking and walking.


John Loret, born in 1928, grew up in Brooklyn, NY before moving to Roslyn, NY. He was a well respected marine biologist, explorer and professor of Queens College and best friends with Ralph. John spent his later years at the Science Museum of LI before passing in

Fulmar – a boat made by high school students from an East New York vocational school was to be used to teach sailing at Camp St. Regis in East Hampton.

Sailing The Fulmar

as told by Ralph Fiorillo In June of 1953, John Loret and I set sail on what would become one of the most challenging and exhilarating journeys of our lives. Our destination was East Hampton, Long Island, where we had summer jobs lined up at a boys' and girls' camp - John as the waterfront director and me as his assistant. But first, we had to get there. And instead of taking the easy route by train or car, we decided to sail the Fulmar, a 24-foot wooden ketch with no engine, from Gravesend Bay in Brooklyn all the way to Sag Harbor.

We set out in the early morning mist around 4:00 AM, the sky still dark, the air damp and heavy. The Atlantic Ocean lay ahead, vast and unpredictable, and without modern navigation, we relied solely on



charts, a compass, and our instincts. Even under the best conditions, this was no small undertaking - a 110-mile journey in a small, engine-less boat, entirely at the mercy of wind and tide. But we were young, adventurous, and eager to prove ourselves.

A Rough Start

The first day was grueling. By nightfall, we had only made it to Jones Inlet, far short of our goal. Worse yet, we had unknowingly sailed too far out to sea, forcing us to tack northeast in hopes of reaching a sheltered inlet before the weather turned.

Our luck ran out quickly. A sudden squall rolled in, the wind howl-

ing and the sea rising angrily around us. With John at the helm, I scrambled to reef the sails, tightening them to stabilize the boat. In my haste, I nearly went overboard. A fall into the raging sea could have meant disaster, but I managed to hold on, heart pounding, hands shaking from the cold and adrenaline.

John studied the charts and spotted a flashing buoy about a thousand feet ahead. If we could just reach it, we could tie up and wait out the storm. As we approached, the Fulmar pitched violently, the buoy bobbing wildly in the churning water. I stood at the bow, rope in hand, waiting for the

continued from page 38 perfect moment. One shot. I swung the line, lassoed the buoy, and tied us up. We were safe - for now.

Exhausted, drenched, and starving, we collapsed into the tiny cuddy cabin, barely able to move. A tuna fish sandwich and slugs of

cider served as our meager supper. Cramped in the low-ceilinged space, we peeled off our wet clothes and tried to warm up. Eventually, the boat's violent rocking settled, and we crawled back on deck. The sky had cleared, revealing a stunning red sunset, the old sailor's

promise of good weather ahead.

"Red sky at night, sailor's delight," I muttered. We desperately needed it.

Into the Great South Bay

The next morning, 4:30 AM sharp, we were back at it. After untying from our life-saving buoy and shaking out the sails, we caught a favorable wind and made good time. The day turned beautiful, with calm waters and clear skies as we sailed into the Great South Bay.

We passed oyster boats, clammers, and ferries, their captains calling out well wishes as they worked the waters between Long Island and Fire Island. The bay was stunning - lined with yachts, fishing boats, and summer homes - but it also hid shallow sandbars that could trap a keel like ours in an in-

And then, it happened.

Without warning, the Fulmar lurched to a dead stop, throwing John and me forward. We had run aground.

Leaping into the knee-deep water, we pushed, rocked, and shoved, but the boat wouldn't budge. The keel was stuck deep in the mud. We tried everything until, finally, after one last desperate heave, the Fulmar broke free without us on board.

Now we had a new problem: our boat was drifting away with the tide, leaving us stranded in the bay.

We looked at each other. No time to panic – we swam after it. continued on facing page

Kicking hard, we caught up, scrambled aboard, and dropped anchor to avoid repeating that mess. Lesson learned: throw out the anchor before jumping in the water.

Unfortunately, we had to learn that lesson five more times before escaping the shallow waters of Moriches Bay.

The Shinnecock Canal Challenge

As we neared the Shinnecock Canal, one of our biggest concerns loomed ahead. The narrow, 200-foot-wide channel funneled water at a fierce six miles per hour – far too strong for us to sail against. Without an engine, we were at its mercy.

To make matters worse, storm clouds rolled in. The wind picked up, the sky darkened, and thunder rumbled in the distance. We had no choice but to drop our sails and anchor at the mouth of the canal, hoping for a break.

That break came in the form of a small motorboat, piloted by a man and his son. Seeing our predicament, they towed us to their dock, where they fed us, let us shower, and gave us a warm meal – a kindness we would never forget. The next morning, they towed us through the canal and into the Great Peconic Bay, waving us off as the sun rose on a perfect sailing day.

The Final Stretch

With the wind at our stern, we sailed butterfly – one sail out to port, one to starboard – cruising toward Sag Harbor at top speed. As we rounded Hog Neck, the harbor came into view.

We cheered.

We had made it! Sag Harbor, a historic whaling town, welcomed us after our improbable journey. But we had one last leg to go – sailing the final stretch to East Hampton, where we would begin our summer jobs at camp.

We arrived one week before opening day, just as planned. Our

journey, which had felt nearly impossible at times, was now another incredible story to tell.

We had sailed 110 miles with no engine, no modern navigation, and barely enough food. We had faced storms, groundings, exhaustion, and near disaster. But we had also seen

sunrises on open water, sailed alongside fishermen in the Great South Bay, and felt the pure thrill of the wind carrying us forward.

Looking back, were we brave or just crazy? Maybe both. But one thing was certain – we had done it.

Journey Through Southeast Asia

Several years ago, we spent three weeks in Southeast Asia. We spent five days in Cambodia, two weeks in Thailand and a week in Viet

Wiang Tan elephant hospital. Veterinarians were fitting one elephant who had lost a foot when she stepped on a land mine. They injected a sick elephant and we watched as tears ran down her face! We also took a tuk tuk ride to the night market and my friend bravely ate a fried grasshopper!

At the Maesa Elephant Camp we saw a demonstration of how the animals are used as work animals.

> then rode one through the jungle. One frisky elephant grabbed a bunch of bananas right out of my hand! The elephants played soccer, and made "masterpieces" by holding a brush in their trunks. Of course, we bought one.

The Hmong live in hilltop villages near the Burmese border where they make beautiful hemp and batik clothing. They believe in spirits and have a shaman, but many of them have converted to Christianity.

The newly constructed homes include six bluebird boxes, six wren boxes, six screech owl boxes, and eight bat houses. These boxes will be installed at optimal locations and heights within Smithtown's parks and beaches, ensuring they benefit local wildlife populations.

"This project is not only about providing a safe habitat for our native wildlife but also about promoting education and environmental awareness... Each box will be clearly labeled to identify which species it was designed for. We hope this initiative inspires the residents of Smithtown to get outdoors, explore nature, and share in



our mission to protect the wildlife that lives among us."

Birdhouses help birds thrive by offering protection and nesting opportunities. In return, birds contribute to weed and insect control, pollination, soil fertilization, seed dispersal, and biodiversity.

Bat houses provide critical roosting and breeding sites, helping declining bat populations while offering natural mosquito and pest control, reducing the need for pesticides.

Screech owl boxes provide safe nesting spots for these nocturnal predators, supporting natural rodent and insect control and encouraging local biodiversity. Beyond their ecological benefits, these bird and bat houses serve as an educational tool—offering a unique opportunity for residents, students, and nature enthusiasts to observe and learn about native wildlife up close.

Encouraging Community Engagement

Residents and visitors are encouraged to keep an eye out for these beautifully crafted homes at Smithtown parks and beaches. Whether taking a stroll at Hoyt Farm, Paul T. Given Park, or the Nissequogue River Headwaters, nature lovers will soon spot these new additions, offering shelter to local birds, bats, and owls.

This initiative reflects the Town of Smithtown's continued dedication to environmental stewardship, ensuring that our wildlife, parks, and natural habitats thrive for generations to come.

How to Cope With Market Volatility

The financial markets always go through periods of instability. And we may see more of that now, given concerns about tariffs, inflation and the economy. As an investor, how can you deal with this volatility?

Some investors try to take advantage of market ups and downs by attempting to follow the age-old advice to "buy low and sell high" – that is, they seek to buy stocks when they feel prices have bottomed out and they sell stocks when they think the market has reached a high point. In theory, this is a great idea, but in practice, it's essentially impossible, because no one can really predict market highs and lows.

Rather than trying to anticipate highs and lows, your best strategy for coping with the price fluctuations of the financial markets is to



diversify your investment portfolio by owning a mix of stocks, bonds and other types of securities. Different types of financial assets can move in different directions at any given time – so, for example, stocks may be up while bonds are down, or vice versa. If you only owned one of these types of assets, and the market for that asset class was down, your portfolio could take a bigger hit than if you owned a variety of asset types.

And you can further diversify within individual asset categories. Stocks can be domestic or international, large-company or small-company – and these groupings can also move in different directions at the same time, depending on various market forces. As for bonds, they too don't always move in a uniform direction, or at least with the same intensity – for instance, when interest rates rise, bond prices tend to fall, but longer-term bonds may fall more than shorter-term contined on facing page

ones, which are closer to maturity with fewer interest payments remaining. Conversely, when rates are falling, longer-term bonds may be more attractive because they lock in higher yields for a longer time. Consequently, one diversification technique for bonds is to build a "ladder" containing bonds of varying maturities.

Some investments, by their nature, are already somewhat diversified. A mutual fund can contain dozens, or even hundreds, of stocks, or a mixture of stocks and bonds. And different mutual funds may have different investment objectives – some focus more on growth, while others are more income-oriented – so, further diversification can be achieved by owning a mix of funds.

Furthermore, some investors achieve even greater diversification

by owning alternative investments, such as real estate, commodities and cryptocurrencies, although these vehicles themselves are often more volatile than those in more traditional investment categories.

While a diversified portfolio is important for every investor, your exact level of diversification – the percentages of your portfolio devoted to stocks, bonds and other securities – will depend on your individual risk tolerance, time horizon and financial goals. You may want to consult with a financial professional about creating the diversified investment mix that's right for your needs.

Ultimately, while diversification can't guarantee profits or protect against all losses, it can help you reduce some of the risks associated with investing and better prepare you to deal with the inevitable volatility of the financial markets – two

key benefits that can help you over the many years you'll spend as an investor.

You must evaluate whether a bond or CD ladder and the securities held within it are consistent with your investment objectives, risk tolerance and financial circumstances. Including callable bonds may increase the interest rate risk of a bond ladder. Bonds may be called prior to maturity, which could result in lower yields with new investments.

So how do we use an essential oil aromatically?

Dominick Michael Salerno


Dominick Michael Salerno passed away peacefully on the evening of April 7th, 2025. He was surrounded by his loving family.
