





#### From Sonar to Sirens – The Life of Marty Thompson

For more than four decades, Marty Thompson has worn two uniforms; each stitched with service, sacrifice and unshakeable love for his hometown and community. As a veteran police officer and dedicated volunteer fireman, Marty has spent a lifetime answering the call – whether it was a helping hand, a safety check, life impacting emergency or smoky chimney. But ask him about it and he will simply reply, "It's what you do for your community."

Marty may have arrived in Saint James as a sixth grader with a Brooklyn accent but still doesn't feel that qualifies him to be a "Saint James Blue Blood." Born in Bay Ridge in a predominately Irish/Norwegian/Puerto Rican community, Marty often rode the old steam locomotive out east to Saint James to visit his grandmother who lived in a



small bungalow on Cambon Avenue, eventually moving here permanently with his family. Over the next sixty plus years he would become one of its most dependable protectors, serving as both a police officer and volunteer fireman.

From a young age Marty was

captivated by the stories of valor beneath the sea, thanks to the television series The Silent Service, which chronicled the daring missions of World War II submariners in the Pacific. Determined to follow in their wake, he joined the Navy Reserve at just 16 years old, setting his sights on submarine and sonar school. His time in the Navy not only fulfilled a childhood dream but also sparked a new calling: public service on land. After completing his active duty, Marty began taking civil service exams for both police and fire departments, eager to continue serving his community. He would remain in the Naval Reserve for an impressive 26 years, laying the foundation for a life dedicated to duty, discipline and protection.

Though the NYPD was the first to call him, Marty held out for a closer continued on page 14

continued from page 12 post with Suffolk County, which soon followed. When the New York Fire Department reached out, he faced a tough decision, but his love for the uniform and the call to law enforcement won out. He spent two years working with the District Attorney's office, but his heart remained with the 4th Precinct, where he spent the majority of his 30 plus year career, ultimately retiring as a respected lieutenant. He fulfilled his dream of being a fireman by joining the St. James Fire Department, where he became one of only three members to have held every rank - from Lieutenant to Commissioner, Even after retirement he still continues to service the community working as a part time police officer in the Village of Head of the Harbor, where he is a familiar and respected presence to residents and passersby alike.



When asked about his greatest influences, Marty fondly recalled his "Sea-Daddy" from the Navy – Jim Thompson, a first-class petty officer and fellow sonar technician. Jim quietly mentored Marty through

example rather than authority. He was the first to instill in him the value of doing something right – not just getting it done. The two remained close for years until Jim's passing. On a deeper, spiritual level Marty credits a woman named Vera Manuel with shaping his understanding of Jesus Christ, a gift that has stayed with him throughout his life.

When he is not working, Marty Thompson can be found fishing, golfing or hunting – often splitting his time between Florida in the winter and his lake house up north. For him, there has never been a bad time to drop a line, especially when reminiscing about casting off at Cordwood Park or Stony Brook Harbor. His approach to hunting is rooted in respect for nature – he only hunts what he consumes and teaches hunter education courses continued on page 72

#### An Historic Home Gets an Historic Renovation



stored it to its former glory.

In 2007, the County employed full-time employees to oversee and maintain the house, but eventually budgetary constraints forced the county to remove those employees. The plan was, once again, to close the house. The

Park Commissioner at the time, Ron Foley, addressed a number of concerned citizens and shared the bleak news about the mansion's future. He opened the door for a cooperative arrangement between the County and a local organization willing to support the property.

Motivated to prevent the mansion from slipping back into its state of extreme disrepair and a

desire to continue to see the property used for the benefit of the community, the Deepwells Farm Historical Society was

formed. The County was a crucial partner in the venture and guided the

group through the transformation. The Historical Society is an all volunteer group that is in contract with the county to run, maintain, repair and utilize the property. Deepwells Farm County Park, as it became known, is owned by the County and under the responsibility of Suffolk County Parks and Historic Services, led by Richard Martin. This almost two decade-old relationship has proven to be an ideal partnership between government and private citizens.

#### Now for some BIG news!

The Historical Society has been very busy with extensive repairs to the mansion's interior and exterior over the past few months. (See pictures). One of the most exciting projects is the restoration of the corner at 25A and Moriches Road.





Under careful guidance of the County, they will be reclaiming the overgrown corner and restoring it to a much more accurate representation of

the past. This will result in making that crucial space in St. James much more attractive. Construction and landscaping began in August.

These and other projects are funded by the efforts of the Deepwells Farm Historical Society Board of Directors. The board includes continued on facing page 20

Nestled in the picturesque pines and lush landscape of St James lies the historic estate of Deepwells Farm. Built in 1845, the original estate covered over 50 acres, encompassing the still existing St James General Store, and the two 125-foot deep, brick-lined wells from which it's name is derived. The mansion, once home to former New York City Mayor William J. Gaynor, was constructed in the vein of 19th-century Greek Revival architecture and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Over the years, through both private and public ownership, the house endured periods of disrepair. In te 1980s the house was acquired by Suffolk County and slowly re-

#### The St. James General Store – A St. James Treasure

by Scott Posner

Back in the day, permission slips from Elementary School were eagerly presented at home in order to make the annual "big" trip to the St. James General Store. The trip today from East Northport to St. James seems much smaller. However, the grandness of the General Store remains. We emptied our piggy-banks and filled our pockets with the change that would then be used for a myriad of fabulous old-time candy.

The St. James General Store is a jewel in our town. First opened in 1857 by Ebenezer Smith, a descendant of Richard "Bull" Smith, it remains the longest running store in America. Its location, in the heart of St. James, had about thirty houses that were mostly concentrated along Moriches Road, Three Sisters Road and Harbor Hill Road.

In the 1840's, Ebenezer lived in the hamlet of Smithtown known as Sherawogge. He headed west with an assortment of goods packed on horseback to trade with Native Americans and settlers in the Mississippi River Valley. After building a successful store out west called the Ebenezer and Everett's Store, he returned home to Sherawogge, which was by then called St. James in honor of the local Episcopal Church.

Much of the history of St. James during this period is associated with the store. Here, the residents purchased yard goods, kitchen wares,



medicine, shoes, horse medicine, tobacco, groceries, hardware, and more. Since the Post Office was located within this store, it became a central meeting place where the townsfolk gathered to wait for the mail, catch up with the local gossip and keep in touch with the world. There were even parties, dances and seasonal celebrations held in the large upstairs room. When the first telephone in the village was installed at the store, it became even more of a community center.

#### THE EARLY RESIDENTS

Most of the early settlers of St. James were farmers. The soil was rich in the area and crops thrived in the fields. Some families, however, made their living by cutting cordwood and hauling it down to the dock at the end of Cordwood Path, a site that is still a short distance from the store. Others harvested shellfish, particularly scallops, soft clams and oysters taken from Stony Brook Harbor. They shipped their catch by schooners to New York City.

Many men also served as captains and sailors on various trading vessels. A cargo of shellfish or cordwood was taken to New York City and traded for the City's abundant horse manure brought back to enrich the farmer's fields. There were also some who worked at shipbuilding. Whatever their labor, these families depended upon the General Store for goods and services.

#### THE CELEBRITIES

In 1873, the railroad arrived in St. James. Immediately, there was fear that the area would fall into the hands of land speculators. That fear, however, never materialized. Instead, a diverse cast of personalities from New York City discovered St. James.

According to local history, Willie Collier, a famous silent actor and playwright was enjoying a bicycle trip from New York City with a few friends. They all stopped to rest in St. James and found the area to be charming. Mr. Collier eventually set continued on page26

continued from page 24 up a summer estate and many famous people followed his lead.

The old store ledgers show the names of William Gaynor (Mayor of New York), Stanford White (world famous architect), Frank McNish, Lionel Barrymore, Virginia Lee and Joe Flynn (actors). Later these early stars and personalities were followed by others such as Ethel and John Barrymore, Lillian Russel, Maud Adams, Buster Keaton, Myrna Loy, Ruth Roman, Irving Berlin and Heavyweight Champion lames I. Corbett. These and many other celebrities signed in at the register of the old General Store, mingling with the farmers, fishermen and tradesmen of the town. In more recent years, James Earl Jones filmed a Bell Atlantic commercial on the front porch of the St. James General



Store.

As the calendar turned from the 1800s to the 1900s, Everett Smith, Ebenezer's son, ran the store. He was a man who could be as colorful a personality as his ancestors. Everett was a prominent Republican and saw to it that all Republican parades commenced from the front porch of the store.

There is also a story that Everett Smith, as a courtesy, stepped outside to deliver mail to women on horseback who did not want to dismount from their horses to go into the store. After a while, he tired of dashing in and out of the store. He posted a sign stating; "People on horseback must enter store for mail." One day, a women entered the store for her mail – on horseback!

An additional old story tells us that architect Stanford White frequently used the telephone to conduct his business. One day, a storm arose quickly while he was at the store. He finished his call and stood quietly on the porch to watch the lightning. Soon, he walked away and when he was a safe distance from the store, a bolt of lightning struck the phone he had just used.

#### **INTO MODERN TIMES**

In 1940, Everett Smith passed away. His father-in-law Karl Ericson, assumed the duties of storekeeper.

Mr. Ericson maintained the store until he was ninety years old.

In 1959 Louise and Andrew Havriski saved the store from a fate as a residence. They maintained the integrity of this landmark with business and service to the community including the preservation of an historic establishment destined to become a living bridge between past and present. In 1980, the store was owned by John and Eleanor Oakley who were also aware of its historic nature. They were concerned that this landmark would become destroyed or misused.

In July of 1990 the 133 year-old general store was purchased in a joint preservation effort between the Suffolk County Department of Parks and New York State. The State bestowed a \$110,000 grant to make the purchase possible.

Today, the store reflects a period between 1880 and 1910. Sales women dressed in Gibson Girl outfits are eager to answer questions about the store's history or to point out the many museum pieces that highlight the rooms. Artifacts from the Victorian time period line the shelves, mingled with the large assortment of merchandise for sale. There are displays of ledgers and old photographs in museum cases. The St. James General Store is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Throughout the years the old store has resisted the changes of progress. It is unchanged structurally since 1894. The original counters and cases, the post office, coffee grinder, tea canisters, pot belly stove, barrels, old checkerboard, and many other items remain to permit visitors to look at the Long Island of the Nineteenth Century.

Today, the store is in the capable hands of "Store Keeper" Stephanie Potts who joined the staff 2 years ago. She is in the center of the photo with team members Bernadette Davis, who joined the staff in 2006. Pat Rohr has been with the store since 1991. Also, behind the counter, you will find Madeline Hoffmann and Doris Cavutu who both have been with the store since 1990. They are a very dedicated crew who all LOVE working at the store and eagerly welcome visitors of all ages. The other photo shows veteran store employee Madeline Hoffmann with new employee, St. James' own Emily Moylan.

When asked what makes the store such a special place, they enthusiastically shared that walking through the door is a wondrous step back in time. A magical place where the bedlam of today is replaced by the nostalgia of a time long past. Where every sense will be engaged – the sound, the smell and the feeling will convince you that a time portal has opened up before you.

Want proof that a true marvel still exists? Find your way over to the St. James General Store. Step in and explore the 2 floors of merchandise dispersed among an impressive display of antiques – helping to keep the past alive. You can even see where the mail was sorted and get a feel for the life the store brought to a very young St. James.



#### Remembering the Tennis Legend From St. James

The next time you either go to, or drive by, Gaynor Park in St. James, take notice of the tennis courts that have been beautifully restored by the Town Parks Department. These courts are the landmark of the legend that once practiced here decades ago as a young boy, and rose to the top ranks in tennis.

There have been many gifted athletes from St. James over the years, some who have gone on to be highly successful collegiates, and others who have pursued professional careers. But there is one whose great achievements are little

remembered today in St. James.
Eugene "Gene" Scott, born in
1937, was a gifted all-around athlete. He graduated from Yale in
1960, and while there, was a varsity
letterman in soccer, ice hockey, lacrosse and tennis. It was his mastery in tennis that carried him to
international acclaim and earned
him entry into the Tennis Hall of

Fame in Newport, Rhode Island.
Although excelling in many sports, it was tennis that was his true love. As a young boy, Gene would wait for his father to get home from work to take him to Gaynor Park to practice his game until darkness fell. He would occasionally write of those early years, continued on page 30



continued from page 28 playing with his father on the old cement courts with a chain link fence net at Gaynor Park.


For most of his playing career, Gene competed as an amateur, only turning pro in 1968 at the age of 31. He competed in his first tournament in 1951 at the young age of 14. Truly a prodigy. Gene reached his highest U.S. ranking in 1963 at #4 and by 1967 was ranked #11. Among the major tournaments he competed in, Gene reached the semi-finals of the 1967 U.S. National Championship (which became the U.S. Open the following year) and three years prior in 1964, reached the quarterfinals of the French Open.

As a member of the U.S. Davis Cup Team during the 1960s, he was friends with, and a roommate with, Arthur Ashe. In 1963, his singles and doubles victories helped the U.S. team win the Davis Cup that year.

Well into his 60s, Gene remained a highly competitive player, maintaining a high ranking within his age group. In 2002, he competed in, and won, the USTA Men's 65 Clay Court Championship. Two years later, in 2004, he won the USTA Mens 65 Grass Court Championship. He followed that success by winning the International Tennis Federation Mens Super Senior World Individual Championship in the age 65 division.

Besides his decades-long playing career, Gene was a major and influential contributor within the tennis world. He was the founder, editor and publisher of *Tennis Week*, the industry bible. He was foremost a champion of players at all levels and worked to expand access to the game for all interested. In his editorials, he would occasionally write of his experience as a boy playing with his father in the old courts at Gaynor Park. He was considered the "conscience of the tennis business."

Always a great ambassador for tennis, Gene was asked to create an



ATP tournament in Moscow. Working with Boris Yeltsin, President of Russia at the time, he founded The Kremlin Cup, a mid-level ATP tournament which ran from 1990 to 2021. He was also the director of numerous tournaments in New Jersey and New York. In 1969, he was a co-founder of the National Tennis League and mentored young players, including John McEnroe and Vita Gerulaitis.


For older readers who might remember the 1973 "Battle of the Sexes" tennis match between Billie Jean King and Bobby Riggs held in the Houston Astrodome, Gene was a television commentator along with Howard Cosell, Frank Gifford and Rosemary Casals.

Having earned a law degree from the University of Virginia in 1964, Gene was also a practicing attorney with his practice in New York City, somehow finding time for his tennis activities and for his family. Gene's immediate family included his wife Polly, and their two children, Lucy and Sam. His mother, Dorothy, was a writer, and his father, Lytton, was the treasurer of the Eastern Tennis Association in the 1960s. In the early 1960s, Lytton served as the mayor of Nissequogue village.

Gene's grandfather Dr. Eugene Sullivan was the inventor of Pyrex glassware and was the Chairman of Corning Glassworks.

What a career-world ranked player, tournament director, author, publisher, commentator and mentor - always spreading the good news about tennis for over five decades. Sadly, Gene passed away in 2006 at the age of 68 from amyloidosis. Two years later in 2008, Gene was inducted in the contributor category into the International Tennis Hall of Fame (ITHF) in Newport, Rhode Island. His widow, Polly, with family present, gave a most meaningful acceptance speech highlighting not only his major accomplishments, but his ardent, tireless work for the sport of tennis. Since 2006, the ITHF annually presents the Eugene L. Scott Award to an individual who embodies Gene's ethical commitment to the game and who has had significant impact on the tennis world.

Let us work on having our Town Parks Department place a memorial plaque at the Gaynor Park tennis courts to honor the ten year old boy who took the lessons he learned on them to unimaginable heights.

#### Japan

Why visit Japan? One reason is that is it halfway around the world, but it is 180 degrees different from the western world. It looks different, sounds different, and its culture is different.

We arrived in Tokyo's Ginza, which is very much like Times Square – crowded, ultra modern and neon. We visited a department store where we were transfixed by the beautiful and artistic displays of food

That afternoon, we visited the Meiji shrine where we witnessed a

Shinto ceremony. Religion in Japan is evenly divided between the two main faiths, Shintoism and Buddhism. Shinto rituals involve worshiping ancestors and nature. Buddhism's basic tenets are belief in the Four Noble Truths, and the goal of Buddhism is to overcome suffering caused by desire.

On to Mount Fuji, also known as Fujiyama which is 12,388 feet high and so majestic. We were lucky to have a beautiful clear day and saw it in all its glory.

We spent a night at a ryokan.

After removing our shoes and donning special slippers, we changed into our yukatas (robes) and were treated to a fabulous kaiseki dinner.



Then we went to the onsen (hot spring bath where men and women bathe in separate areas. You undress and leave clothes and bath towel in a basket. You wash thoroughly, then go to the communal big soaking pool. No modesty here – and no photographs either!

We visited a workshop in Hakone where an artisan made beautiful objects out of marquetry. He layered different types of wood using an ancient painstaking process.

The Hakone Openair Museum exhibits the world's greatest artists such as Dubuffet, Calder and Picasso in a magnificent mountain setting.

Another experience – a bullet (shinkansen) train ride to Kanazawa. The spotless train has reserved seats and is extremely efficient, keeping a schedule to the minute.

We walked around the beautiful city and visited the Kenruen Gardens and the Kanazawa Castle and attended a tea ceremony after which we walked around the Higash-Chaya District where there are many old wooden structures and geisha tea houses.

We feasted at the huge Omi-cho food market and tasted squid jerky and shaved dried seaweed.

Shirakawa is a mountain area with gashi-show style steeply



pitched roofs which protect the houses from the winter snows. They cultivate silk worms here and we made sticky rice buns from scratch, actually grinding the rice into flour.

Kivoto is the original capital of Japan containing gorgeous temples, such as the Golden Pavilion.

The bullet train took us to Hiroshima, the final lap of our trip. After visiting the beautiful tori at Miyajima, we spent the afternoon at Hiroshima Memorial Peace Park which contains a museum, a cenotaph and a Children's memorial. We were touched to see the Genbaku Dome, the one building left standing to remind us of the devas-

#### Getting a Hearing Test May Be Good for Your Memory

If you want to help your memory and cognitive performance, you may want to get a hearing test and if necessary treat your hearing loss. There is a growing body of research that shows a definitive link between hearing loss and cognitive function.

According to Brandeis University Professor of Neuroscience Dr. Arthur Winfield, effortful listening due to unaddressed hearing loss is associated with increased stress and poor performance on memory tests. His research shows that even when people with unaddressed hearing loss perceive the words that are being spoken, their ability to remember the information suffers, more likely because of the draw on their cognitive resources that might otherwise be used to store what has been heard in memory. This is especially true for the comprehension of quick, informational complex speech that is part of everyday life. "Even if you have a mild hearing loss that is not being treated, cognitive load increases significantly, says Winfield. "You have to put so much effort just to perceive and understand what is being said that you divert resources away from storing what you have heard in your memory." As people move through middle age and their later years, as Winfield suggests, it is reasonable for them to get their hearing tested annually. If there is a hearing loss, it is best to take it seriously and



treat it.

A number of studies have come to light over the past few years showing a link between hearing loss and dementia. Specifically, a pair of studies out of John Hopkins found that hearing loss is associated with accelerated cognitive decline in older adults and that seniors with hearing loss are significantly more likely to develop dementia over time than those who retain their hearing. We have been spreading this information for a number of years now and I strongly believe that these facts are important for patients and their care takers to keep in mind when forgetfulness becomes apparent. Many experts believe that interventions, like hearing instruments, could potentially delay or prevent dementia. Research is ongoing.

Other studies indicate that maintaining strong social connections and keeping mentally active as we age might lower the risk of cognitive decline and Alzheimer's ac-


cording to the Alzheimer's Association. Also interesting is the Better Hearing Institute research shows that people with hearing difficulty who use hearing instruments are more likely to have a strong support network of family and friends, feel engaged in life and meet up with friends to socialize. Some even say that using hearing instruments has a positive effect on their relationships.

In our lifetime many of us have ups and downs in relationships and in either physical or mental health. The idea is to control the negative effects which we are faced with so it does not have a long lasting or serious effect on our lives. We should pay attention and listen to what our body is telling us, and take whatever step that is necessary to arrive at what one feels is the correct treatment. From a hearing standpoint it's simple, get a hearing test. For most, an annual audiometric evaluation is covered by health insurance, often with little or no out of pocket expense. Think about it and then listen to your body... it's speaking. All you have to do is... listen.

Dear Ron,





Marty admits it's not always easy being the bearer of bad news, perhaps in the form of a cell phone or speeding ticket, but tries to approach the task with discernment and compassion knowing its part of the responsibility he has taken on. To him, law and order means little without compassion – and it's that balance that defines his service. And in moments when circum-

stances are dire and every second matters, a steady presence makes all the difference. It is in those times of urgency that calm leadership is needed most, and the value of having a man like Marty Thompson around become crystal clear.

Marty says that his greatest accomplishment isn't found in a badge or a title, but in choosing his wife of over 50 years, Gwen – a partnership that has brought him three marvelous children and seven adorable grandchildren ranging in age from 4 to 26. Despite all he's seen and done, he remains a student of life grateful to have been "the guy in the right place, at the right time with the right training." Though he's been honored by both the County and the Town for his decades of service, Marty does not seek recognition. He hopes simply to be remembered as someone who did the right thing and was there when people needed him. A life of quiet integrity and dedication to others is the legacy he's proud to leave behind.
